The Virginia Marine Resources Commission (VMRC) proposes to amend Chapter 4VAC20-270-10 et seq., "Pertaining to Blue Crab Fishery", to establish management measures, including season and bushel limits, for the 2024-2025 commercial crab fisheries and to amend the daily time limits for commercial harvest.

Mandate and Impetus

[Mandate] VMRC is authorized by § 28.2-201 of the Code of Virginia to promulgate regulations and guidelines necessary to carry out the provisions of Title 28.2.

[Impetus] Results from the Bay-wide Winter Dredge Survey, as well as harvest results from the 2023 fisheries, indicate the Chesapeake Bay blue crab stock is currently not overfished and overfishing is not occurring and total abundance is holding steady. Fisheries managers from the Chesapeake Bay jurisdictions (Maryland, Potomac River Fisheries Commission, and Virginia) recommend status quo crabbing measures for the coming year. Staff further recommends a 12-hour daily time limit, (3 a.m.- 3 p.m.) for any person licensed to catch and sell crabs taken by hard crab pot or peeler pot to take and harvest crabs from any hard crab pot or peeler pot, or to retrieve, bait, or set any hard crab pot or peeler pot. Amending the current 8-hour workday provisions to a 12-hour workday would eliminate the need for any exemptions to be applied for and processed by staff, removing a regulatory burden for regulants and staff, and provide commercial harvesters greater flexibility in determining when they will start and stop their crab harvest day.
