In 2023, the General Assembly adopted Universal License Recognition (ULR), allowing for unified standards for transferring licenses into Virginia for occupations regulated by the Department of Professional and Occupational Regulation (DPOR). The law allows regulatory boards to require a jurisprudential (state law) exam of ULR applicants, if such exam is required of other applicants. The Virginia Real Estate Board adopted the requirement that applicants under ULR pass the Virginia Real Estate Exam, its jurisprudential exam and incorporated the ULR requirements into its regulations.

Mandate and Impetus

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In March 2023, the Governor approved Chapters 2 (HB 2180) and 3 (SB 1213) of the 2023 Acts of Assembly, adopted ULR, allowing for unified standards for transferring licenses into Virginia for occupations regulated by the Department of Professional and Occupational Regulation. The new law allows regulatory boards to require a jurisprudential exam of ULR applicants, if such exam is required of other applicants. The amendments became effective on July 1, 2023.

The purpose of this regulatory change is to implement the jurisprudential exam authorized under §54.1-205.C.
