The 2012 General Assembly passed, and the Governor signed into law, HB 1061 and SB 489, which amend § 22.1-253.13:4 of the *Code of Virginia* to strengthen postsecondary education and workplace readiness opportunities for all students, and to consolidate the number of Board of Education-approved diplomas.

The legislation eliminated the General Achievement Diploma by folding it into the Adult High School Diploma, which would be re-named the General Achievement Adult High School Diploma. The legislation added a requirement that adult students would need to earn a Board of Education-approved career and technical education credential, such as the successful completion of an industry certification, a state

licensure examination, a national occupational competency assessment, or the Virginia workplace readiness skills assessment in order to be awarded the diploma.

The General Achievement Adult High School Diploma would include the following requirements:

 Achievement of a passing score on the GED<sup>®</sup> examination (now amended to successful completion of the requirements to earn a high school equivalency certificate approved by the Board of Education);

- Successful completion of an education and training program designated by the Board of Education;
- Achievement of a Board of Education-approved career and technical education credential such as the successful completion of an industry certification, a state licensure examination, a national occupational competency assessment, or the Virginia workplace readiness skills assessment; and
- Completion of other requirements as may be established by the Board.

The emergency regulations became effective July 17, 2013.

In 2014, HB 1007 replaced references of a General Educational Development (GED<sup>®</sup>) program or test throughout the *Code of Virginia* with "a high school equivalency examination approved by the Board of Education." This one update is reflected in the permanent regulations; otherwise, they are exactly the same as the emergency regulations.

On April 23, 2015, the Board of Education approved the permanent amendments to the *Regulations Governing Adult High School Programs* and the repeal of *the Regulations Governing the General Achievement Diploma* to replace the emergency regulations.

HB 1061 and SB 489, passed by the 2012 General Assembly and signed by the Governor, amended § 22.1-253.13:4 of the *Code of Virginia* to require the Board of Education to promulgate these changes to the regulations.

In 2014, HB 1007 replaced references to a General Educational Development (GED<sup>®</sup>) program or test throughout the *Code of Virginia* with "a high school equivalency examination approved by the Board of Education."

These amendments would make the emergency regulations permanent. The permanent regulations comport with the provisions of HB 1061 and SB 489, as passed by the 2012 General Assembly and signed by the Governor.

#### **Substance**

These regulations are necessary to implement the provisions of HB 1061 and SB 489. The legislation eliminated the General Achievement Diploma by folding it into the Adult High School Diploma, which would be re-named the General Achievement Adult High School Diploma. The legislation added a requirement that adult students must earn a Board of Education-approved career and technical education credential, such as the successful completion of an industry certification, a state licensure examination, a national occupational competency assessment, or the Virginia workplace readiness skills assessment in order to be awarded the diploma. The legislation further provides that the General Achievement Adult High School Diploma would include the following requirements:

- Achievement of a passing score on the General Educational Development (GED<sup>®</sup>) examination (now amended to successful completion of the requirements to earn a high school equivalency examination approved by the Board of Education pursuant to HB 1007 (2014);
- Successful completion of an education and training program designated by the Board of Education;
- Achievement of a Board of Education-approved career and technical education credential such
  as the successful completion of an industry certification, a state licensure examination, a national
  occupational competency assessment, or the Virginia workplace readiness skills assessment;
  and
- Completion of other requirements as may be established by the Board.

These regulations are designed to enhance preparedness for the workplace and for postsecondary education and strengthen educational and career opportunities for adult students. They also support

expanded learning opportunities for adult students by enhancing workplace skills through the attainment of a career and technical education credential for adult students earning the General Achievement Adult High School Diploma.

		The regulations would set forth the requirements for a student to earn a General Achievement Adult High School Diploma by;  1. Successfully completing the requirements to earn a high school equivalency examination approved by the Board of Education.
