The guidance provides that cosmetologists who obtained their license prior to September 1, 2024, are eligible to perform straight razor shaving based on the cosmetology scope of practice defined in the Code of Virginia. Cosmetologists who perform straight razor shaving without the appropriate training may be subject to disciplinary action by the Board. The guidance also provides that licensed cosmetology schools may employ licensed and certified barber or master barber instructors to provide training on straight razor shaving on face and neck in a cosmetology school. The new guidance does not impose any new requirements.
