This regulation is necessary to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the children and adults served by ALF, ADC, and child welfare agencies. No complaints or comments were received. The regulation does not overlap, duplicate or conflict with federal or state law. The regulation includes requirements that are also included in the Code of Virginia; however, the regulation provides additional information that is not in the Code. The additional detail in the regulation helps applicants and licensees to better understand licensure requirements. This regulation explains requirements affecting all licensed programs.

The last significant revision was completed in 2006 and exempt regulatory actions were completed in 2011, 2013, 2017, 2019, 2021, and 2023 to align it to statutory changes. The regulation now needs to be amended for technical and clarification purposes, and to reduce regulatory burdens. The amendments will have a minimal economic impact on small businesses.
