These regulations are promulgated under the State Board of Local and Regional Jails (previously known as the Board of Corrections). Originally established under authority of §53.1-5.1 of the Code of Virginia, action by the 2020 Acts of the General Assembly (Chapter 759) repealed §53.1-5.1, divesting the Board of authority to promulgate these regulations. Therefore, the Board no longer has the authority to promulgate regulations regarding human subject research within the Department of Corrections and these regulations should be repealed under 6VAC 15. During the same legislative session, Chapter 759 added new language in §53.10 directing the Director of the Department to promulgate regulations for human research. New regulations will be promulgated under 6VAC 16 as appropriate.

These regulations are not necessary under 6VAC 15. Due to changes in the Code of Virginia to §53.1-5.1 and §53.10 (Chapter 759, 2020 Acts of the General Assembly), the Board has no authority to issue these regulations. Therefore, they will be repealed under 6VAC 15.

However, these regulations are essential to safeguard human subject research and effectuate the provisions under Chapter 5.1 (§32.1-162.16 et seq.) of Title 32.1 for human research, as defined in §32.1-162.16. New regulations will be issued under 6VAC 16 as appropriate.

Decision

Repeal the regulation under 6VAC 15.

On 3/16/2022, the Board voted unanimously to repeal this regulation. Due to changes in the Code of Virginia to §53.1-5.1 and §53.10 (Chapter 759, 2020 Acts of the General Assembly), the Board has no authority to issue these regulations. Therefore, they will be repealed under 6VAC 15.
