The promulgating agency is the State Board of Social Services. State authority is contained in the Code of Virginia § 63.2-217. Other provisions under this section derive their authority from §§ 63.2-102 through 105 and 63.2-805 G regarding confidentiality of client information collected from of public assistance, child support enforcement, and social services programs. In addition, the confidentiality of human research activities involving public assistance, child support enforcement, and social services, child support enforcement, and social services programs and clients is governed by 22VAC40-890, Human Subject Research Regulations, established pursuant to § 63.2-218 of the Code of Virginia.

Effectiveness
