Epidemiologist report	<ul> <li>State Epidemiologist Report by Daisy Banta</li> <li>Concern expressed that STEMI data may be muddled by inclusion of EKG findings that are not specific to STEMI.</li> <li>Concern expressed that the pain management numbers are not believable.</li> <li>Committee asked that BLS transports be removed from the pain numbers</li> <li>Discussion regarding Dexamethasone for Bronchospasm – Discussion regarding increased use of ORAL</li> <li>DEXAMETHASONE. Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) & Board of Pharmacy (BOP) Compliance Issues	<ul> <li>AMIR LUCA discussed FDA letter: Apparently there is no problem with VA EMS Drug system according to a letter from the DEA. George Lindbeck thinks that the letter referenced from the DEA might not really mean what it says, he also points out that the Hospitals are likely done with the Drug Box Programs.</li> <li>Dr. Luca asked what the effort is to move the "artificial" deadline out to a more realistic timeline. What is OEMS doing to help agencies with this effort? There was no response from any OEMS official in the room.</li> <li>Dr. Reed asked for a unified response from OEMS on extending the "deadline" for drug box change over. Mr. Passmore said that OEMS did advocate to maintain the Drug Box system – he says that he cannot really do anything.</li> <li>Dr. Turnbill asked for a letter from OEMS supporting Drug Box changeover deadline delays.
