I. Call to order/Welcome:	The meeting was called to order at 1001 by Chairman Bolling. A quorum requires at least four members, five members are present. III. Approval of Minutes:	The August 1, 2024, meeting minutes were approved as submitted. Motion to Approve Robert Trimmer, Second Mark Barenklau Passed.	No further action is required
IV. Committee Business: 1. Staff Reports Executive leadership OEMS report	 Rachel Stradling: Karen Owens has resigned, VAOEMS will need a new deputy director. Scott Winston is retiring; his last day is February 3, 2025. Michael Berg has advised he is staying for foreseeable future. Rachel Stradling is visiting all the EMS councils and trying to visit them all prior to the new director coming on board. Several contract issues have come up including Dr. Lindbeck as medical director. Hope to have Dr. Lindbeck back on board shortly. Michael Berg: Quarterly report posted on website. The current grant cycle includes 84 grants submitted. 74 from ems agencies and 202 items total. 4 have been disqualified for various reasons. Part of the challenge this cycle is probably due to lack of training and preparation for 	No further action is required.

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	this cycle. Travel and training has been approved to restart and should help. Training will be offered regionally. Update on encumbered grants, all invoices have been paid as well as return to locality funds. 3.7 million Encumbered, 4 of them are coming up at end of year and should be completed, which will leave 3.2 million. Membership status of the FARC committee sent out. J C Bolling and Tracey Hangar are both coming off in July. Thomas Jefferson and Central Shenandoah EMS councils are next up for representation. Rachel Stradling thanked Michael Berg for his work and ability to get things caught up, "he stepped up to the challenge" and she wanted to thank him personally for all his hard work and diligence. 2. Unfinished Business:	Amber Moore: All PSAP centers must have EMD training by July 1, 2024, and funding fromRSAF is no longer a priority status for PSAPs and EMD. Ideas for funding categories from thecommunications committee, are quality assurance, CE, EMD instructors, video 911 upgrades.The communications committee is looking for feedback from the FARC committee. TracyHanger advised PSAP and EMD funding came from 911 services board in the past, unsure ifthat is still available. J C Bolling asked Michael Berg about funding for EMD through RSAF.Michael Berg stated it was a priority item and was removed and replaced this cycle by itemsneeded due to medication regulation changes. Nothing prohibits these grants but, priorityfunding status would need to be decided by the FARC committee. Amber Moore stated shewould like to see new EMD centers a priority. J C Bolling: Centers not yet upgraded could bemade a priority by reviewers on Communications committee just like any local grant review.The communications committee are experts, and your opinion helps greatly. Discussioncontinued and no further action taken.	No further action is required.
Virtual/Closed meeting update	Michael Berg : Follow up questions from the FARC committee in reference to, virtual meetings, closed meetings. The attorney general's office advised FARC cannot have virtual meetings. This is due to the FARC committee being specifically identified in Code of VA and not part of the EMS Advisory Board and falls under the public meeting policy. The FARC committee would need to create a policy, post for comment and have it vetted. Then a vote by the FARC committee to approve the policy. Mohamad Abbamin also advised that a virtual policy and remote policy would be needed. Nothing allows FARC to have a closed meeting.	No further action is required.
EMS Medication Management Systems	The Code of VA states 54 exemptions and FARC does not fall into any. Ranking and grading meeting will be open to the public. Again, this is due to FARC not being a part of the advisory board but works with the advisory board. Discussion continued and no further action taken. Michael Berg : EMS Medication management systems, Old Dominion and Tidewater had	No further action is required.

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3. New Business:	largest number of requests and medication management systems were a priority this cycle.	
Reviewing Parameters for RSAF grants	Michael Berg : Review of grant parameters, discussion in reference ATV/UTV grant requests. Linwood Pulling told Michael Berg that at one-point RSAF funded ambulances, cots and EKG monitors and the list has grown over the years. Discussion continued in reference to the ability to fund requests and if the committee should reevaluate parameters for funding. A consensus was reached by the committee and chairman Bolling thinks we should establish a white paper for meeting with vision moving forward. Visions change with time, and it would be advantageous to have a position paper on requests, ATV/UTV for example. 202 items requested this cycle, and some requests present as "throwing in grant just to see." Chairman Bolling is looking to put together a work group at the next FARC meeting with input from the Transportation committee. The RSAF grant program also needs common terms for equipment to enable a better flow of information. All committee members need to be prepared to discuss this issue at the next meeting.	Will be added to the next meeting's Agenda. No further action is required.
VAOEMS Special System Initiative Award for ePCR	 Rachel Stradling: OEMS EMS system Initiative Award for ePCR. This would be a special grant cycle initiative for ePCR due to the current ePCR being cancelled by VAOEMS. Effective 7-1 2025 VAOEMS will host a repository only. Several agencies are struggling to fund software for ePCR reporting. This will be for ems agencies only. Funding only for a basic ePCR. Michael Berg: This needs to come before the FARC committee to move on to the GAB (Governor's EMS Advisory Board). With FARC approval it will be presented tomorrow to the GAB. It will be open December 1, 2024, through January 3 2025, with an award date of March 31, 2025. Starting with this initiative the new hardship funding status is 70/30 from 80/20. The awards will not be coming from RSAF funds and will be open to non-profit agencies only. Discussion continued followed by a motion to support this initiative Tracy Hangar, second Mark Barenklau motion passed. 	No further action is required.

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Transportation Committee work effort	Steve Simon: Gave a presentation from the Transportation committee on ATV/UTVs with pictures of each type. Presentation included information on types of vehicles and skid units. Extensive discussion about uses and modifications of ATV/UTVs and how useful for ems they really are. Chairman Bolling asked transportation to give recommendation for the FARC committee on funding these vehicles. Greg DeYoung asked if these vehicles have, we funded in the past? Chairman Bolling stated requests get submitted frequently and knows at least of 1 that was funded 20 years ago but stated they usually don't get funded. Tracy Hangar advised it goes back to available funding for RSAF doesn't go as far as it used to due to the expense of items these days.	Update expected from the Transportation Committee at a future meeting.
