Steve Harris, director of Flight Operations and Safety, presented an overview of aviation safety in the Commonwealth, including aircraft accident statistics. Mr. Harris reviewed the details of the nine accidents that had occurred since the May 2013 meeting, stressing the pilot and pilot in command deficiencies that contributed to the accidents. He also announced the dates for the next Safety Week, October 7-10.

Mr. Burdette then updated the board and attendees on aviation issues and activities across the Commonwealth. Topics included the status of AWOS installations; results of recent outreach events, such as the Virginia Women Can Fly event series that had a total attendance of 365; and upcoming events, noting the October 14 deadline for the aviation photo contest. He recognized the conference committee for its hard work to make the 2013 Aviation Conference such a success.

Mr. Page discussed the outlook for funding in federal Fiscal Year 2014, progress for getting projects under grant in Fiscal Year 2013, and the outlook beyond Fiscal Year 2014. He highlighted upcoming changes, including updates to standard operating procedures for Airport Layout Plan, CSPP, and property map review and approval, as well as a revised Airport Improvement Program Handbook.

b. State Participation for AWOS Systems and Maintenance

Mr. Burdette provided information on the initiative to increase the state's share of funding related to AWOS systems. Mr. Inman asked about the impact of such a change as it relates to air carrier airports, to which Mr. Burdette responded that the state does not provide assistance for federally owned systems. Mr. Inman made a motion to increase state participation in AWOS systems and maintenance funding from 80 percent to 95 percent. Mr. Coburn seconded the motion. The board approved the motion.
