DOAV staff, state government representatives, federal government representatives, airport sponsors and managers, consultants, engineers, business owners, and city and county representatives were also present.

1. Call to Order John V. Mazza, Jr.

Chairman

Mr. Burdette called the meeting to order at 8:55 a.m.

2. Board Member Introductions John V. Mazza, Jr.

Chairman

Mr. Burdette suspended the introductions of the board members as they were made during the workshop.

2. Review and approve minutes of May 21, 2015 John V. Mazza, Jr.

Chairman

Mr. Burdette shared that Peter D'Alema with VRA brought up a comment that the minutes of the last meeting did not capture Mr. Oakey's motion to accept the VRA's recommendation to utilize Option 3 with the condition that the recommendation goes to the VRA board and no problems are found that would impact the program, the motion was appropriately seconded, and the board unanimously approved the motion. Mr. Burdette asked that, with the amendment, if there were any other comments on the minutes. There being none, the May meeting minutes were approved with the amendment.

3. Reports/Announcements:

a. DOAV Report

Randall P Burdette DOAV

Mr. Burdette updated the board and attendees on aviation issues and activities across the Commonwealth. The presentation topics included upcoming IS-BAO and ISO-9000 audits for the agency; access to public-use airports in the state as calculated in the Virginia Air Transportation System Plan Update underway; the upcoming economic impact study; an update on the Virginia Commercial Airport Strategic Review; updates on system studies including the pavement management, sustainability, and workforce development studies; updates on the remote tower project at Leesburg and the air taxi initiative; work in progress for a new aeronautical chart and agency website upgrade; and upcoming events around the state.

In response to questions about the website, Mr. Burdette said a goal for the air taxi program was to have an icon on airport websites that will allow airports, service providers, and passengers the ability to tie together. Regarding educational outreach, while the current website does not offer video, the redesign of the website should allow "one-stop shopping" for information, including educational materials.

Steve Harris with DOAV provided an update on the five accidents in Virginia since the last meeting, bringing the year-to-date total to ten. He talked about knowledge, procedures, judgement, and leadership as part of pilot-in-command ability. Mr. Harris said that in response to the many concerns expressed about drones during the roundtable discussions, the agency will try to bring information on drones and their operations at airports into the spring safety week agenda. He encouraged airport managers and others to report incidents and concerns involving drones to the agency. He reminded attendees of the fall safety week in September.

b. FAA Report

Matthew J. Thys FAA WADO

Mr. Thys shared that his office now has a second environmental protection specialist, Susan Stafford. She works in the Beckley office and will be handling some projects in Virginia, mainly for airports located in the western part of the state.

Mr. Mazza stated that, based on comments at the roundtable discussions, he would like for the state staff to get with WADO to discuss opportunities for increasing efficiency in environmental reviews.

In response to questions on reauthorization, Mr. Thys said WADO was working to finalize all grants for Fiscal Year 2015 by the end of August. If reauthorization does not occur and a resolution offers a year of coverage, that office plans to run a normal grant program. Mr. Thys said sponsors should start planning now how to move projects forward if the federal agency is faced with multiple programs within a funding cycle.

c. VAOC Report

Todd D. Shiller, President VAOC

Mr. Shiller thanked the board for its support during his time as president of the Virginia Airport Operators Council (VAOC). He took the opportunity to remind the board of the purpose of the VAOC, including communication, education, and legislative outreach. He reported on the 29th annual meeting of the VAOC which was held on August 19. Mr. Rempe, incoming president, awarded a plaque to Mr. Shiller on behalf of the VAOC.

5. New Business

a. Manassas Regional Airport Bridge Loan Repayment P. Clifford Burnette DOAV

Mr. Burnette reviewed the staff recommendation to extend the repayment period by 12 months for the expired bridge loans for the Charlottesville-Albemarle Airport and the Manassas Regional Airport. The extension will allow the sponsors time to formulate repayment plans. Mr. Hardwick made a motion to accept staff recommendation. The motion was appropriately seconded. The board unanimously approved the motion.

b. Richmond Executive-Chesterfield County Airport Terminal Building Space Repurposing

P. Clifford Burnette DOAV

Mr. Burnette reviewed the request from the Richmond Executive-Chesterfield County Airport to repurpose space within the terminal to allow the county management team to temporarily occupy the flight planning room for a two-year period, under a memorandum of agreement between the county and state. The equipment from that area would be available in another area of the airport so there would be no loss of service to users. If after the two-year period the county has not negotiated a contract with a tenant for a new hangar with office space, the county will reimburse the state approximately \$14,000. Staff recommended allowing the repurposing under these terms formalized by a memorandum of agreement.

Mr. Oakey recused himself from board action on this issue due to his company's professional relationship with parties related to Chesterfield. Mr. Hall made a motion to accept staff recommendation. The motion was appropriately seconded. The board unanimously approved the motion.

c. Virginia Aviation Board Review
Tentative Allocations from the Commonwealth Airport Fund

J. Michael Swain DOAV

Mr. Swain reviewed the funds available for capital projects as of July 1, 2015, noting that the \$26,004,745.48 was the highest amount of available funds to date. In response to a question, he confirmed that the allocation breakdown between entitlement and discretionary funds is based on the *Code of Virginia*. Mr. Swain then reviewed the report of funds available to the board for the August meeting, noting that activity during July increased the amount of General Aviation Discretionary funds available.

Mr. Swain provided the quarterly reports on the effect of the increased AIP match and the reimbursed cost of site plan reviews charged by localities. To date, the increase in the state match has not adversely impacted the ability to fund projects. During the last quarter, DOAV did not reimburse any funds for site plan reviews.

Mr. Swain presented the FY2015 Entitlement Utilization Report for the Washington Dulles International Airport, which staff had reviewed and found satisfactory. Mr. Hardwick made a motion to accept the staff recommendation to approve the report. The motion was appropriately seconded. The board unanimously approved the motion. Mr. Swain reminded the board that the due date for Entitlement Utilization Reports is September 16, and if the sponsor of an air carrier airport is not requesting state discretionary funds, the sponsor does not have to submit a report for the August meeting. He also reviewed the entitlement funds each air carrier airport would be receiving throughout the fiscal year.

Mr. Swain presented the project requests and staff recommendations. The board actions are summarized below. These results are available at www.doav.virginia.gov. After the allocations were awarded, the following state discretionary funds were available:

Air Carrier/Reliever Discretionary \$5,827,310.36 General Aviation Discretionary \$231,560.19

For Region 1, Mr. Quillin made motions by airport to accept staff recommendations for the allocation of capital funds. The motions were appropriately seconded. The board unanimously approved all motions.

Depending on the age and condition of equipment, sponsors may not pass the equipment to others due to issues with maintenance and the availability of parts.
