evaluation tool. She stated that the FCCPT works with 3 types of evaluations: (1) Type 1 is for foreign trained graduates who are trying to enter the U.S. on a HBI visa (2) Type 2 is for those individuals who are already in the U.S. and are changing to a Type 2 visa and (3) an Educational credential review.

PROPOSED REGULATIONS

Ms. Young provided a list of other credentialing agencies used in the past: International Education Consultants and International Consultants of Delaware.

Dr. Shoaf made a motion, which was seconded, that the Committee change 18VAC112-20-50(B)(1) to read as follows: "Utilizes the Coursework Evaluation Tool for Foreign Educated Physical Therapists of the Federation of State Boards of Physical Therapy and utilizes original source documents to establish substantial equivalency to an approved physical therapy program;" The motion carried unanimously.

Dr. Shoaf made a motion, which was seconded, that the Committee change 18VAC112-20-65(B)(1) to read as follows: "In lieu of meeting such requirements, an applicant may provide evidence of clinical practice during the five years immediately preceding application for licensure in Virginia with a current, unrestricted license issued by another U.S. jurisdiction. For the purpose of this subdivision, clinical practice shall mean at least 2,500 hours of patient care over a five-year period: The motion carried unanimously.
