PROPOSAL: for title protection for SLP's. The committee directed staff to call DOE for information.

	IOR TO LOWSHIP	The Committee discussed the current regulation of licensure prior to the clinical fellowship year. The Committee also discussed public protection issues of licensing individuals prior to a clinical fellowship. Residency within the medical profession was provided as an example of a temporary license prior to final examination and including a training program. The Committee requested the Executive Director to seek an opinion from Board counsel regarding 54.1-2603 and if it allows the Board to create a temporary license occupation. Also, the Committee voted to recommend to the Board to support a new notice of regulatory action to establish a temporary license occupation. The Committee recommended that the license only exist for 12 months after the completion of the coursework required for completion of a Master's degree and prior to completion of residency (meaning a fellowship year) requirement. There would be only one renewal period of an additional 12 months. On a properly seconded motion by Dr. Eid the committee agreed to have draft legislation on a limited license presented at the May Board meeting.
