RECONVENE: Having certified that the matters discussed in the preceding

closed session met the requirements of § 2.2-3712 of the Code, the Committee reconvened in open session and

announced its decision.

DECISION	
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The Committee ORDERED that this matter be CONTINUED generally under the following terms: Dr. Raciti shall submit to a neuro-psychological evaluation, to include such testing as deemed appropriate, by a Board approved clinical psychologist and have a written report of the evaluation including diagnosis, recommended course of treatment, prognosis and any recommendations submitted to the Board within ninety (90) days of the date the order is entered.

Upon receipt to the report the psychological evaluation, the Committee shall review said report and render their decision in this matter.
