Evelyn Brown invited Howard Casway to inform the Board members of "Consent Orders for Surrender of License" procedures to expedite Board actions becoming effective. A motion was made by Dr. Hatt to allow the Executive Director of the Board to sign consent orders for surrender of license. The motion was properly seconded by Dr. Kuley. Discussion followed. The motion was carried.

Regulatory Committee: Benjamin Foster

No formal report. An informal discussion was held regarding the "One Time Fee Adjustment". At this time it appears the Board will be operating without deficit by the next renewal period, June 30, 2004.

<u>Discipline Committee</u>: Dr. Neimeier reported there are currently 12 complaints in investigations; two (2) cases at Board level, one (1) conference held since December 10, 2002; seven (7) cases in APD; and nine (9) licenses on probation.

Credentials Committee:

Diana Pollick reported that there have been eight (8) reviews since the last meeting on December 10, 2002.

Continuing Education Committee:

Dr. Hathaway reported that he had met with enforcement and the details are being worked out for the audit process. It is estimated that it will take one hour of time per audit. Research is being done regarding what other Boards due when non-compliance issues arise. Dr. Hathaway also reported that four (4) new CE providers have been approved since the last meeting.
