The Chair recognized Mr. Curry and invited his comments regarding the allegations. Mr. Curry addressed the Committee.

The Committee convened into executive session pursuant to § 2.2-3711(A)(28) of the Code of Virginia for the purpose of deliberation to reach a conclusion regarding the allegations outlined in the Notice of Hearing. The Committee reconvened in open session.

Mr. Boehm certified in a motion that the Committee discussed only issues exempt from the Freedom of Information Act while in executive session. A vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Curry's license to practice social work was placed on probation with terms and conditions.
