ORDERING OF AGENDA

Overview of Board of Social Work - Evelyn B. Brown, Executive Director

Ms. Brown, Executive Director of the Board of Social Work, gave an overview of the Board and the workings of the Board. She outlined the regulatory process and how long it takes to get regulations changed and the many stages required to make a regulatory change. She explained that the statutory amendment is more difficult and requires approval of the General Assembly.

Review of House Bill 1146 – David Boehm, Chair, Board of Social Work

Mr. Boehm reviewed HB 1146 with the Committee and noted that the Committee is charged with determining if current education and training requirements for social workers are adequate to assure the public of professional competency; and whether current exemptions from requirements for licensure best serve the citizens of the Commonwealth.

Presentation ASWB – Donna DeAngelis, Executive Director

Job Analysis

Ms. DeAngelis discussed the Job Analysis from the Association of Social Work Boards. She explained the process for arriving at the Job Analysis. Discussion followed.

Exam Content

Ms. DeAngelis reviewed the various examinations currently being offered in all states. She reviewed the examinations that Virginia offers and the licenses represented by the examinations. Discussion followed.

Focus Group: Scope of Social Work Practice

Following a lengthy discussion regarding the Scope of Social Work Practice, Debra Riggs moved to accept the definition from ASWB Model Law. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously.
