New Business

Privacy laws, policies and procedures prohibit the sending and receiving of Social Security Numbers and DMV Control numbers over an unsecure circuit. After discussion, and a motion by **Mr. Middleton**, seconded by **Mr. Dowdy**, the Committee unanimously recommended the Board adopt a cut-off of July 31, 2013 as the last date that rosters will be accepted on the current server. After this date all education providers must transmit student rosters in an electronic format to the secure server. In addition, course completion certificates will not be accepted from students for course rosters that were not transmitted properly.

Interpretation of Regulations - Necessity of Contract*

Executive Director, Eric Olson and Department Investigators shared with the Committee that recently there have been several instances where the interpretation for "routine maintenance" has been questioned and presented in a manner that warrants additional clarification of the previous interpretation by the Board. After discussion and a motion by Mr. Middleton, seconded by Mr. Dowdy, the Committee agreed to address this issue through regulatory review. Therefore, the Committee unanimously recommended the Board adopt a Notice of Intended

Executive Director, Eric Olson introduced Dale Dodson of the North Carolina State Board of Examiners of Plumbing, Heating & Fires Sprinkler Contractors. Mr. Dodson gave an overview of North Carolina's elimination of the continuing education requirement for trade-related licenses.

Legislative Update*

Board staff presented an update regarding the regulatory reform package submission for the Individual License and Certification regulations and copies of the public comments received. Board staff also presented to the Committee as statistical data a Continuing Education Fact Sheet.

Board staff presented an update regarding five other regulatory packages submissions and copies of the public comments received.

Examination Exemption Agreement*

The Committee reviewed the suggested language revisions for the examination agreement presented by the Maryland Board for HVACR Contractors Board (Maryland Board). The revisions specify Virginia tradesmen who receive their license by card exchange will not be exempted from the Maryland HVAC examination. Further, disclosure of disciplinary action must be provided within the verification of licensure documents. After discussion and a motion, by Mr. Gelardi, seconded by Mr. Vander Pol, the Committee unanimously recommended the Board adopt the agreement revisions.
