Patrick & Henry Community College

Bill Ferguson provided a report for the continuing education course he audited.

On February 25, 2023, Mr. Ferguson audited a Contractors Pre-License Course given by Patrick & Henry Community College. This was an unannounced audit of the course titled Contractors Pre-License Course. The instructor listed on education provider's website was Rodney Clark.

Staff arrived at the facility at 7:40 a.m. and entered through the building lobby. The attendees present were aware of the classroom location from pre-registration information. Upon the instructor recognizing the number of attendees in the classroom in relation to the number of attendees registered, board staff identified himself to the instructor. Staff audited the course from 7:55 a.m. to 4:20 p.m.

The course met the eight-hour requirement of instruction. The subject matter that was covered was in accordance with the information in the course materials. The course's location, date, time of instruction, and instructor agreed with the course information on the education provider's website.

The class was conducted in accordance with the Board's education provider requirements.

Examination Fees

Examination Fees

Marjoric King, Executive Director informed the Committee currently within the Regulations there's a cap the exam vender may charge per examination. This regulatory action removes the exam cap completely and aligns with other Boards here at the agency. By removing the exam cap completely, the department is able to negotiate a contract more successfully with the exam vendor through the Virginia Public Procurement Act. This exam cap has been determined to be problematic when attempting to expand exam services to include multiple languages.

A motion was made by Mr. O'Dell seconded by Mr. Trice to adopt the proposed language to remove the exam fee cap.

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Apprenticeship Exam Waiver

Apprenticeship Exam Waiver

Marjorie King, Executive Director informed the Committee a regulatory package was previously submitted to begin the process of amending the Boards regulations to exempt individuals from the journeyman trade examinations if an applicable trade apprenticeship program was completed. Board staff was advised by the Attorney General's Office to pull this regulatory action and resubmit it as an exempt action due to §54.1-1131. §54.1-1131 provides an exam exemption for individuals applying for a tradesman license that have completed an apprenticeship program approved by the Commissioner of Labor and Industry. Due to this, the Board's Regulations are more restrictive than the statute and must be amended.

A motion was made by Mr. O'Dell seconded by Mr. Spencer to withdraw the current regulatory package and resubmit it as an exempt package.

The motion was approved with a vote of 6-0-0. Ayes: Groh, Johnson, Trice, O'Dell, Spencer, and Heinline Nays: None Abstain: None Absent: Tomlin, and McGonegal.

Universal Licensing

Marjorie King, Executive Director informed the committee Senate Bill 1213 was passed by the General Assembly during its 2023 session and signed by Governor Younkin on Friday March 3, 2023. The universal licensing recognition bill allows for additional pathways to licensure for out of state individuals and becomes effective July 1, 2023.

A motion was made by Mr. Spencer seconded by Mr. O'Dell to initiate an exempt regulatory action and align the Boards Individual License and Certification Regulations to the statute.
