	Dr. Hahn acknowledged that Ms. Douglas was honored as a recipient of the 15 Year Executive Officer Recognition Award and for three years of service to Executive Committee of the NLCA. Additionally, Ms. Douglas was elected as Vice Chair of the New NLC Commission.

DIAGLOGUE WITH DHP	
DIRECTOR:	 Lisa Hahn, DHP Chief Deputy, welcomed new Board Members and Staff. She then provided the following information on behalf of Dr. Brown: DHP has acquired new space on the first floor where the Copy Center, Reception, IT, and DHP Call Center staff will be located. DHP anticipated the move to be completed by Thanksgiving. Phase I will be the moving of 23 – 25 staff to the first floor. Phase II will be the moving of Board of Dentistry (BOD) staff to the Data area and reconfigure small Boards into BOD space. Phase III will be expanding Board of Nursing space. There are Customer Service and Copy/Mailroom Workgroups currently discussing the implications of the move. Continuance requests have impacted the Virginia Performs results through the Key Performance Measures (KPMs) of DHP. Beginning October 2017, once the continuance is granted, the clock will stop in the DHP case tracking system. This will ensure that Boards are not penalized for the variables that are outside of their control. Ms. Douglas explained further that KPMs are ways to measure disciplinary processes related to and patient care cases which are to be processed within 250 business days. DHP is developing Board training videos such Sanction Reference Points (SRPs) and probable cause (PC) review, which will be available on DHP website. From the 2017 Legislative session, two statewide workgroups were convened, Opioid Curriculum for healthcare providers and aPrescribing
	 ePrescribing. DHP has added "File Complaint" icon to the DHP website as easy method to file complaints electronically. This was implemented September 1, 2017.

The second meeting was on September 14, 2017, 12 Chief Nursing Officers (CNO) attended as well as VHHA Leadership who acknowledged improvement in application processing time. Ms. Douglas will be presenting the Enhanced Nurse Licensure Compact (eNLC) and NURSYS information at Virginia Organization of Nurse Executives & Leaders (VONEL) on November 17, 2017.
	Nurse Licensure Compact (NLC) Commission August 15, 2017 Meeting <u>Report</u> Ms. Douglas stated that it was an interesting meeting where the old/current NLC meeting was convened in the morning and the new eNLC Commission meeting was convened in the afternoon with 120 people attending. She noted that most states will be in new Compact and there was discussion what to do with states that are not in the new Compact. She added that the new Compact went into effect on July 20, 2017 and is scheduled to be implemented on January 19, 2018. She said that more information will be provided at the Board Development Workshop this afternoon.

Executive Director Report

November 14, 2017

Meetings/Speaking Engagements

- Conference Call with PearsonVUE for the Nurse Aide Exam– Dr. Paula Saxby, Deputy Executive Director, for the Virginia Board of Nursing, participated in a conference call on September 21, 2017 with staff from PearsonVUE. This call was requested by PearsonVUE staff to announce that the program manager assigned to Virginia is resigning from this position, effective October 15, 2017. An interim program manager has been assigned to Virginia with plans for a permanent replacement to occur in the near future. Board staff will be informed of the contact information for the interim program manager. PearsonVUE does not anticipate any gaps in the customer service for Virginia applicants for the nurse aide exam (NNAAP).
- Nurse Aide Education Train-the-trainer presentation Dr. Paula Saxby, Deputy Executive Director for the VA Board of Nursing presented information at a train-the-trainer course for nurse aide educators on September 26, 2017 in Charlottesville. Topics of the presentation included nurse aide testing, nurse aide education program curriculum, principles of delegation, application and review process for approved nurse aide education programs, new NNAAP testing process, and history of the nurse aide registry in Virginia. There were 17 nurse aide educators in attendance.
- Meeting with the Virginia Community College System On Friday, October 6, 2017 Charlette Ridout, Senior Nursing Education Consult, attended a meeting with the Program Directors and the concept based curriculum writing team. Currently four out of the 19 ADN programs have implemented the core concept based curriculum. The remaining programs will implement the concept curriculum in the fall if 2018. The programs who have implemented the concept curriculum shared information regarding what has worked well and areas of needed improvement. Ms. Ridout was present to answer questions regarding regulatory requirements.
- Conference Call with PearsonVUE regarding the nurse aide (NNAAP) exam– Paula Saxby and Brenda Krohn, Deputy Executive Directors for the Virginia Board of Nursing, participated in a conference call on October 12, 2017 with staff from PearsonVUE regarding the nurse aide exam (NNAAP). Issues discussed included the following:
 - Scheduling dates for the exam within 30 days of applying;
 - Number and consistency of evaluators throughout the state;
 - Regional and in-facility test sites;
 - > Candidates who have passed the exam not showing up on the file transfer or registry; and
 - Status update on the new skills portion of the exam.
 - The PeasrsonVUE program manager for Virginia is a new staff member who will look into the above issues and report back to Board of Nursing staff as soon as possible.

The next conference call will be on November 17, 2017.

• On Thursday, October 26, Charlette Ridout, Senior Nursing Education Consultant, presented information regarding the Regulations for Nursing Education Programs to the faculty, RN and PN program directors and the Department Dean of Piedmont Community College.

Virginia Board of Nursing Executive Director Report November 14, 2017

- Fundamentals for Supervisors presented by the Performance Management Group at VCU Beth Yates, Supervisor and Licensing by Examination Specialist, and Marie Molnar, Licensing Supervisor, for the Board attended the three-day conference which was held at the Glen Allen Cultural Arts Center and covered topics such as communication and feedback, performance management, and team building. It was an excellent presentation and was especially geared toward government agencies so it was very relevant. There was a wide range of state agencies represented and we had many group activities and the opportunity to discuss about real-life situations with peers at other agencies.
- VCU Langston Center for Quality, Safety and Innovation Dr. Paula Saxby, Deputy Executive Director for the Virginia Board of Nursing, participated in the above symposium titled "Patients and Practitioners: Partnering for Health" on October 3, 2017. There were presentations from the family and patient perspective as well as presentations on how to involve the patient and families in different care experiences.
- The Opioid Curricula Workgroup Steering Committee Charlette Ridout, Senior Nursing Education Consultant, by invitation of Dr. Brown attended the second meeting on Friday, September 29, 2017. The meeting focused on the review of the draft core competencies for educational programs who teach prescribing practitioners, establishing a separate work group to develop the core competencies for educational programs who teach non-prescribers, the development of online learning modules available on the VA Aware website for both current prescribers and students, and the development of an online portal that can be used as a resource repository for educators.
- Enforcement Training On October 2, 2017, Jodi Power, Senior Deputy Executive Director, and Robin Hills, Deputy Executive Director for Advanced Practice represented the Board of Nursing and facilitated three round-robin sessions with Enforcement Staff. Dialogue covered topics including patterns seen in complaints and investigations, thoughts and requests in handling certain case trends including increased nurse practitioner, education program, fraud-related cases, as well as mandatory reports of mental health admissions of licensees. Enforcement staff also provided an update on board activities, new laws and regulations, and staff structure and board member changes in 2017, all which proved to be an informative and useful exchange between investigative and board staff.
- eNLC Training in Charlotte, WV Jay P. Douglas, Executive Director for the Board of Nursing, assisted NCSBN in eNLC Training in West Virginia on October 23-24, 2017 with the RN and LPB Boards.
- VAHQ Conference Presentation On October 26, 2017, Senior Deputy Executive Director Jodi Power for the Board of Nursing provided a presentation as part of the Virginia Association of Healthcare Quality's 40th Annual Education Conference in Richmond, Virginia. Ms. Power's presentation was entitled "Trends in Nursing Regulation, Education and Practice from the Virginia Board of Nursing's Perspective" and covered information regarding a national environmental scan on issues impacting the nursing workforce, healthcare landscape, nursing education, practice and regulation, which are similar to issues experienced at our state level; Virginia Board information and activities were shared as well. The presentation was well received by the approximate 50-60 attendees present. Immediate feedback indicated an invitation for the Virginia Board of Nursing to speak again can be expected at next year's conference.

Virginia Board of Nursing Executive Director Report November 14, 2017

- Virginia Community College System (VCCS) Non-Traditional Gender Summit– Dr. Paula Saxby, Deputy Executive Director for the Virginia Board of Nursing, was invited to participate in the above conference regarding recruiting men in the nursing profession. This conference was sponsored by the VCCS, Post-secondary Perkins Programs and was held on November 1, 2017 in Richmond. All community college nursing programs, as well as CTE Directors were in attendance. Dr. Saxby presented statistics from the DHP Workforce Data Center on numbers of men enrolled in nursing education programs, as well as the number of men licensed as either LPN's or RN's in Virginia. Strategies for recruiting men in nursing were discussed, as well as admissions criteria for nursing education programs.
- **DHP Paperless Workgroup meeting on November 1, 2017** Jay P. Douglas, Executive Director for the Virginia Board of Nursing, participated in this workgroup, who is moving forward with plans for online verifications, self-service, and paperless license options.
- **2017 Fall Conference: (VNA) Virginia Nurses Association's Nurse Staffing Summit** Jay P. Douglas, Executive Director for the Virginia Board of Nursing, attended the VNA Fall Conference. The focus topic was the challenging in the nursing workforce. The VA Action Coalition presented their research on "Practicing to the top of your RN license."
- 2018 Spring Conference (VNA) Virginia Nurses Association: The Opioid Crisis and Nursing's Role Jay P. Douglas, Executive Director for the Virginia Board of Nursing, participated in a planning meeting on November 6, 2017 for the conference which will be held in the Spring of 2018.
- Massage Therapy Advisory Board's Annual Meeting on November 7, 2017 Most significant business item was that they recommended to the Board changes to Guidance Document 90-61 regarding disposition of disciplinary cases against CNAs, RMAs, and LMTs practicing on expired certificates, registrations, and licenses. A full report will be provided at the January Board of Nursing meeting.
- Implementation of the Enhanced Nurse Licensure Compact (eNLC)

Training - Jay P. Douglas, Executive Director for the Virginia Board of Nursing, provided training regarding eNLC, which will be implemented on January 19, 2018, to Enforcement Division.

Jay P. Douglas, Commissioner for eNLC, has participated in two Executive Committee meetings via telephone conferences regarding implementation.

Jay Douglas, Executive Director, and Key Board Staff participated via telephone conference call in a meeting with ENL Commission on October 5, 2017. A final draft of rules was adopted and will be made available by the Commission for a 60-day comment period.

Board of Nursing Staff continue to work on operational changes necessary for eNLC implementation. Implementation Team includes Jay Douglas, Anne Tiller, Stephanie Willinger, an Alesia Baskins.

NCSBN Leadership and Policy Conference Report

New Orleans, October 11-13, 2017

The theme of the conference was "Leadership of the Greatest Generation." Speakers focused on the leadership strengths of Eleanor and Franklin Roosevelt sharing early recordings of radio talks with the American people during the WW II era. An additional speaker from the Hyde Park, NY FDR Presidential Library reflected on the successes of Eleanor Roosevelt's policy action and advocacy and her methods of obtaining the admiration and support of the American public. We learned about the initiative to bring a Women's History Museum to the DC Mall. A granddaughter of one of the original" Black Women of NASA" spoke of the intelligence of these women and the racial discrimination they endured even while bringing their engineering and mathematical expertise as the "Hidden human computers." The conference ended with a breakfast and tour of the National WW II Museum.

Beyond the theme presentations we heard a panel entitled "South Dakota House of Nursing" and their journey to achieve passage of legislation for NP full practice authority. This included State Senator Deb Soholt, the SD lobbyist, and Gloria Damgaard the Exec. Dir. of the SD BON. We were schooled in the political feasibility model and how to be persuasive in politicized environments. An entertaining presentation titled "Generational Legislative Relations Strategies" and a presentation on the impact of social medial on public policy and decision making helped us feel empowered to more effectively communicate with stakeholders and legislators.

Three conference "take aways":

- 1. Always ask for more than you want. This makes it easy to negotiate and give back what you really didn't want in the first place. This is an effective strategy.
- 2. Use social media to reach out to stakeholders and legislators.
- 3. Feel empowered to lead change because it will lead to enacting policy.

VIRGINIA BOARD OF NURSING

BY LAWS

Adopted: May 23, 1988 Revised to Incorporate Changes in *Code of Virginia*: April 1989 Last amended: November 13, 2012

Guidance Document: 90-57

BYLAWS OF THE VIRGINIA BOARD OF NURSING

Article I – Name.

This body shall be known as the Virginia Board of Nursing as set forth in § 54.1-3002 of the *Code of Virginia* and hereinafter referred to as the Board.

Article II – Powers and Duties.

The general powers and duties of the Board shall be those set forth in § 54.1-2400 of the *Code of Virginia* and the specific powers and duties shall be those set forth in § 54.1-3005 of the *Code of Virginia*.

Article III - Mission Statement.

To assure safe and competent practice of nursing to protect the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the Commonwealth.

Article IV – Membership.

A. The Board shall be comprised of thirteen fourteen members. Seven members shall be registered nurses, one two of whom shall be a licensed nurse practitioners, three members shall be licensed practical nurses and three members shall be citizen members.

B. All members shall be appointed by the Governor for terms of four years. No member shall be eligible to serve more than two successive terms in addition to the portion of any unexpired term for which he may have been appointed.

C. Each member shall participate in all matters before the Board.

D. Members shall attend all regular, **discipline** and special meetings of the Board unless prevented by illness or similar unavoidable cause from doing so by unavoidable cause.

E. The Governor may remove any Board member for cause, and the Governor shall be sole judge of the sufficiency of the cause for removal pursuant to § 2.2-108.

Article V – Nominations and Elections.

A. The officers of the Board shall be a President, **First** Vice-President and **Second** Secretary Vice-President elected by the members.

B. The Nominating Committee shall:

1. Be comprised of three members of the Board to be elected at the meeting immediately preceding the annual meeting held in January;

2. Elect its chair;

3. Prepare a slate of at least one candidate for each office to be filled;

4. Distribute the slate of candidates to all members in advance of the **annual** meeting;

5. Present the slate of nominees to the Board for election at the annual meeting; and

6. Be governed by *Roberts Rules of Order* (current edition) on nominations by a committee in all cases not provided for in this section.

C. Election

1. The President shall ask for nominations from the floor by office.

2. The election shall be by voice vote with the results recorded in the minutes. In the event of only one nominee for an office, election may be by acclamation.

3. The election shall occur in the following order: President, Vice President, Secretary.

4. The election shall be final when the President announces the official results.

D. Terms of office

1. All terms will commence at the close of the annual meeting March 1.

2. The term of office shall be for the succeeding twelve months or until the successor shall be elected. No officer shall serve more than three two consecutive twelve-month terms in the same office unless serving an unexpired term.

3. A vacancy in the office of President shall be filled by the **First** Vice-President. The Board shall fill a vacancy in the office of **First** Vice-President or **Second Vice-President** Secretary by election at the next meeting after which the vacancy occurred.

Article VI – Duties of Officers.

A. The President shall:

1. Preserve order and conduct all of Board proceedings meetings according to these bylaws, parliamentary rules **Robert Rules**, the Administrative Process Act and other applicable laws and regulations;

2. Call special meetings;

3. Appoint all committees, except the nominating committee;

4. Appoint annually three members to the Committee of the Joint Boards of Nursing and Medicine; and

5. Review and approve non-routine applications for licensure, certification or registration as referred by Board staff.

B. The **First** Vice-President shall:

1. Preside in the absence of the President;

2. Succeed to the office of President for the unexpired term in the event of a vacancy in the office of President; and

3. Assume such functions or responsibilities as may be delegated by the President or the Board.

C. The Secretary Second Vice-President shall:

1. Certify minutes of all Board proceedings;

2. Perform all other duties pertaining to this office and not otherwise delegated to staff; and

3. Assume such functions or responsibilities as may be delegated by the President or the Board.

Article VII – Committees.

A. Executive Committee:

The Officers of the Board shall constitute the Executive Committee, who which shall represent the interests of the Board in meetings within the Department of Health Professions, with other agencies of the Commonwealth or other organizations as directed by the Board. The Executive Committee may review matters pending before the Board and make recommendations to the Board for action.

B. Standing Committees

1. Members of the standing committees shall be appointed by the President following the election of the officers for a term of twelve months.

2. Standing Committees shall include:

Committee of the Joint Boards of Nursing and Medicine Discipline Committee Education Committee

C. Special Conference Committees shall be comprised of at least two members of the Board and shall:

1. Review investigative reports resulting from complaints against licensees.

2. Recommend appropriate proceedings for complaint resolution.

3. Conduct informal hearings proceedings pursuant to §§ 2.2-4019, 2.2-4021, and 54.1-2400 of the *Code of Virginia*.

D. Advisory Committees

1. Advisory Committees shall consist of three or more persons appointed by the Board who are knowledgeable in a particular area of practice or education under consideration by the Board.

2. Such committees shall review matters as requested by the Board and advise the Board relative to the matters or make recommendations for consideration by the Board.

E. Ad-Hoc Committees

1. Ad-Hoc Committees comprised of Board members and/or staff may be appointed by the President to assist in fulfilling the powers and duties of the Board.

2. Such committees shall be advisory to the Board and shall make recommendations to the Board for action.

3. A Committee shall be appointed by the Board every three years to review Board of Nursing guidance documents and make recommendations for revisions and/or deletions.

Article VIII – Meetings.

A. The Board shall meet in regular session at least in January of each year for its annual meeting and at such other times as the Board may determine.

B. Special meetings shall be called by the president or by written request to the President from any three members, provided there is at least seven days notice given to all members.

C. A telephone conference call meeting may be held to consider suspension of a license pursuant to § 54.1-2408.1 pending a hearing when the danger to the public health or safety warrants such action and when a good faith effort to convene a regular meeting has failed.

D. An affirmative vote of a majority of those serving on the Board who are qualified to vote or those serving on a panel of the Board convened pursuant to § 54.1-2400 shall be required for any action to suspend or revoke a license, certificate, or registration or to impose a sanction, except an affirmative vote of a majority of a quorum of the Board shall be sufficient for the summary suspension of a license. An affirmative vote of three-fourths of the members of the Board at the hearing shall be required to reinstate an applicant's license or certificate suspended by the Director of the Department of Health Professions pursuant to § 54.1-2409. An affirmative vote of a quorum of the Board shall determine all other matters at any regular or special meeting.

Article IX – Quorum.

A. A quorum for any Board or committee meeting shall consist of a majority of the members.

B. No member shall vote by proxy.

Article X – Parliamentary Authority.

Roberts' Rules of Order (current edition) shall govern the proceedings of the Board in all cases not provided for in these bylaws, the *Code of Virginia* and the Regulations of the Board.

Article XI – Amendment of Bylaws.

These bylaws may be amended at any meeting of the Board by a two-thirds vote of the members present and voting provided copies of the proposed amendments shall have been presented in writing to all members at least 30 days prior to the meeting at which time such amendments are considered.

Article XII – Probable Cause Review and Determination Discipline.

A. When the Board of Nursing receives an investigative report from the Enforcement Division, a preliminary review of the case is made to determine whether probable cause exists to proceed with an administrative proceeding on charges that one or more of the Board's statutes or regulations may have been violated. The Board of Nursing staff, who are professional nurses, is delegated the authority to determine if there is probable cause

to initiate proceedings or action on the Board's behalf. If after reviewing the file, the staff determines probable cause does not exist, or that the Board does not have jurisdiction over the matter in question, the staff may review the case with a Special Conference Committee to determine if the case should be closed. Additional delegation to Board of Nursing professional discipline staff is authorized pursuant to Guidance Document #90-12 for certain disciplinary activities pursuant to Guidance Document # 90-12.

B. The initial review by Board staff may also determine if the case constitutes grounds for a possible summary suspension. A summary suspension occurs, pursuant to § 54.1-2408.1, when the Board determines that substantial danger to the public health or safety exists should the respondent retain his license, certificate or registration. If Board staff determines the case should proceed as a possible summary suspension, the case is forwarded to the Administrative Proceedings Division. After preparation of the case for presentation, the Administrative Proceedings Division forwards the information to the Attorney General's Office for assignment and possible prosecution. If it is agreed that the information should be presented to the Board as a possible summary suspension, the Board may meet by telephone conference call, provided a good faith effort to assemble a quorum of the Board has failed. Should the Board decide that an order be entered that summarily suspends a practitioner's license, the order is served personally on or mailed to the respondent, along with a notice of formal hearing.

Article XIII – Nurse Licensure Compact.

A. Pursuant to § 54.1-3037 of the *Code of Virginia* the Executive Director of the Board of Nursing shall be the Administrator of the Compact for Virginia and shall perform the duties of the Administrator according to the requirements of the Nurse Licensure Compact.

B. The Board of Nursing shall comply with the Policies and Procedures of the Nurse Licensure Compact Administrators as outlined in the current manual.

The Committee discussed and reviewed the <u>2016 Infusion Nurses Society Standards</u> provided by Ms. Conklin. The proposed changes to Guidance Document 90-6 were reviewed in light of comments received from the public.

Ms. Douglas informed the Committee that a request for public comment on the draft document was sent to the Virginia Nurses Association (VNA), the Virginia Organization of Nurse Executive Headers, Virginia Hospital and Health Care Association (HHCA), and the Legislative Coalition of Virginia Nurses. She added that five comments were received in support of proposed changes with minor suggestions for change and no comments in opposition were received.

There was not any member of the public present to address the Committee.

The Committee discussed the possibility of including licensed practical nurses (LPN's) in Guidance Document 90-6. Factors considered were the education preparation of LPN's, the scope of practice of LPN's and the need for a comprehensive patient assessment associated with insertion and removal of PICC Lines. Ms. Conklin made the Committee aware that in some jurisdictions respiratory therapists and LPN's are authorized to insert and remove PICC Lines. Virginia Board of Nursing GD 90-6 Committee Meeting Minutes July 18, 2017

The Committee decided that this guidance document not be modified to include LPN's. Suggested changes to the draft distributed to the public on June 12, 2017 include:

- Insert "or central venous access devices" after (PICC) lines; and insert "physician assistant, or nurse practitioner" after a license physician in the introduction paragraph
- Insert "and removal" at the end of item # 2
- > Insert into item # 4 "insertion, removal, and maintenance of these devices."
- > Insert into item # 5 "*on insertion*" after axillary vein
- Include footnote reference to "Infusion Therapy Standards of Practice Infusion Nurse Society 2016"

Ms. Douglas was directed to seek advice from Board Counsel about obtaining and attaching the Infusion Nurses Society Standards to the guidance document.

Next steps:

- Provide the Committee with a clean draft of Guidance Document 90-6 that incorporated the above changes
- Provide final draft to Board Counsel for review
- > Present final draft to the full Board at the September 2017 meeting

Peripherally Inserted Central Catheters (PICC) Line Insertion and Removal by Registered Nurses under Appropriate Circumstances

Virginia Code § 54.1-3000 defines registered nursing as

the performance for compensation of any nursing acts in the observation, care and counsel of individuals or groups who are ill, injured or experiencing changes in normal health processes or the maintenance of health; in the prevention of illness or disease; in the supervision and teaching of those who are or will be involved in nursing care; in the delegation of selected nursing tasks and procedures to appropriately trained unlicensed persons as determined by the Board; or in the administration of medications and treatments as prescribed by any person authorized by law to prescribe such medications and treatment.

This definition includes the insertion and removal of Peripherally Inserted Central Catheters (P1CC) lines <u>or central venous access devices</u> upon order of a licensed physician <u>assistant</u>, or nurse practitioner. In specific clinical practice settings, factors to be considered include:

1. The registered nurse possesses substantial knowledge and experience in intravenous therapy.

2. The registered nurse has specialized education and can demonstrate competency in line placement *and removal*. This documented education shall include a theoretical and clinical component.

3. The registered nurse documents continued competence in performing the skill <u>and use of technology</u>.

4. The agency or institution employing said nurses has established policies and procedures regarding the use of these devices insertion, use, removal, and maintenance of these devices.

5. Confirmation by radiologic <u>or by other imaging technology</u> of catheter position is required when tip placement is positioned beyond the axillary vein *on insertion* prior to use of the PICC for any reason.

6. The placement of a PICC line may only be carried out in structured, clinical settings where the equipment and expertise of other health professionals to manage complications are readily available. Accepted:January 27, 1993Revised:July 15, 2008

INTRODUCTIONS: Committee members, Advisory Committee members and staff members introduced themselves.

ESTABLISHMENT OF A QUORUM:

Ms. Hershkowitz called the meeting to order and established the quorum was present.

Virginia Board of Nursing Committee of the Joint Boards of Nursing and Medicine Minutes October 11, 2017

ANNOUNCMENT: Ms. Hershkowitz welcomed and introduced Dr. Hills as the Deputy Executive Director for Advanced Practice for the Board of Nursing.

Ms. Hershkowitz welcomed Dr. O'Connor to the Committee of the Joint Boards of Nursing and Medicine. She added that Dr. O'Connor replaced Dr. Reynolds. She hopes that Dr. O'Connor will enjoy being on the Committee. She stated her appreciation of Dr. Reynolds for his service.

Ms. Hershkowitz also welcomed Dr. Lapito as the Physician member on the Advisory Committee to the Committee of the Joint Boards of Nursing and Medicine. Dr. Lapito shared his background information with the Committee.

Ms. Douglas noted that Dr. Poston recently resigned her appointment at the Board of Nursing. She added that Dr. Hahn, Board of Nursing President, will appoint a new member to replace Dr. Poston on the Committee of the Joint Boards of Nursing and Medicine. Ms. Hershkowitz thanked Dr. Poston for her service.

- REVIEW OF MINUTES: The minutes of June 7 Special Conference Committee and Business Meeting, were reviewed. Ms. Gerardo moved to accept all the minutes as presented. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously.
- PUBLIC COMMENT: Mary Duggan, American Association of Nurse Practitioners (AANP), asked for clarification regarding "*tramadol*" on page 3 of the June 7 Business Meeting minutes where it stated "While "*tramadol*" is an opioid type of drug, it was determined that it will be kept in 18VAC90-40-160(C), 18VAC90-40-190(D), and 18VAC90-40-270(D)".

Ms. Hershkowitz thanked Ms. Duggan for her comment and added the Committee will take into consideration her comment.

DIALOGUE WITH AGENCY DIRECTOR:

Dr. Brown reported the following on the two opioid bills that were passed by the 2017 General Assembly:

- Electronic prescription of opioids will begin July 1, 2020 and the Workgroup was established and convened to look at New York Board's model. The Workgroup concluded the following:
 - > Acknowledged the crisis of opioid abuse
 - Technology is a big issue since less than 10% of practitioners use electronic prescribing
 - ➤ Agreed with the effective date of 2020
 - Identified exemptions for people who are not required to prescribe electronically
- The Secretary of Health and Human Resources convened a workgroup that includes experts to establish common curriculum for training health care providers in the safe prescribing and appropriate use of opioids and pain management. The initial meeting was held on May 19, 2017 and

Subcommittees were established in the areas of pain management, recognition and treatment of addiction, and developing essential curricula. The next step is to establish a Workgroup of non-prescribers by the end of October 2017.

• Early Prescriptive Monitoring Program (PMP) data has shown a downward trend of numbers of opioid prescribed since regulations for prescribing opioid for pain management went into effect in March 2017.

Dr. Lipato noted that there are no valid pain assessment tools available to clinicians that measure a patient's functionality instead of or in addition to the pain scale. Dr. Brown stated that more current pain assessment tools are needed in order to get prescribers away from using pain scale alone when developing pain management plans of care.

Dr. O'Connor asked how pain medications are tracked in the PMP. Dr. Brown said that PMP has in place a system to track numbers of prescriptions filled. Dr. Brown added that currently Veterinarians are not required to report to PMP when prescribing opioids, but they do report when dispensing opioids; however, the Board of Veterinary Medicine did implement a guideline aimed at decreasing the prescribing of opioids.

OLD BUSINESS:

Regulatory Update:

Ms. Yeatts reviewed the chart of regulatory actions, as provided in written handout, noting that the comment period for NOIRA for supervision and direction of laser hair removal will end November 1, 2017. She added that comments have already been received. She stated that the regulations for nurse practitioners will need to be amended to define "direction and supervision" and the next task is to convene a Committee with all three professions to establish proposed language.

Ms. Hershkowitz asked what the three professions are. Ms. Yeatts said Physicians, Physician Assistants, and Nurse Practitioners.

NOIRA for Eliminating of a Separate Prescriptive Authority License:

Ms. Yeatts stated that the Board of Nursing (BON) and Medicine have discussed the elimination of separate license for prescriptive authority for nurse practitioners. She added that there is no provision in the Code to require a separate license. She noted that the languages of both regulations (Regulations Governing the Licensure of Nurse Practitioners and Regulations for Prescriptive Authority for Licensed Nurse Practitioners) will be combined. She said that the action to implement elimination must be regulatory and begin with a Notice of Intended Regulatory Action (NOIRA).

Ms. Hershkowitz asked Ms. Douglas to provide background information regarding this action. Ms. Douglas reminded members of Ms. Willinger written report submitted at a prior meeting and noted that administratively, this is less burdensome and more efficient for applicants. Additionally, Ms. Douglas added

that the two separate licenses created confusion for the public. Ms. Douglas noted that the Committee did not see any disadvantage for this action.

Dr. O'Connor moved to recommend to the BON and BOM the adoption of a NOIRA to begin regulatory process for elimination of a separate prescriptive authority license. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

NEW BUSINESS: Board of Nursing Executive Director Report:

Ms. Douglas reported the following:

- New APRN Compact has been developed and three States (South Dakota, Wyoming, and Idaho) have adopted. Virginia current laws and regulations are a barrier to Virginia joining.
- Veteran Affairs NCSBN is doing work with Veteran's Affairs Administration regarding expanding the scope of practice of APRNs and Board's access to information necessary for investigations.
- The New Enhanced Nurse Licensure Compact (eNLC) for RN's and LPN's only went into effect on July 20, 2017 and is scheduled to be implemented on January 19, 2018. The eNLC establishes uniform licensure requirements and no Multi-State Privilege (MSP) license is issued if an individual does not meet these requirements. Additionally, a MSP license from another compact state can be the basis for an NP license.

ePrescribing Workgroup Update

Ms. Douglas stated that this was provided by Dr. Brown earlier.

BHP Report

Ms. Douglas highlighted actions taken by the BHP at its last meeting noting that the Board accepted the recommendation of the Regulatory Research Committee to not license Certified Anesthesiology Assistants (CAAs.)

Resignation of Cathy A. Harrison, DNAP, MSN, CRNA, Committee of the Joint Boards Advisory

Ms. Douglas noted that Dr. Harrison was with the Committee for a short time. She added that Dr. Harrison was hired by DHP as Investigator. Ms. Hershkowitz thanked Dr. Harrison for her service.

<u>Appointment of Joint Boards CRNA Advisory Committee Member –</u> <u>Recommendation of Colonel Janet Setnor from VANA:</u>

Ms. Hershkowitz stated that Colonel Setnor's Biography and CV are presented for the Committee consideration and action for the CRNA position on the Advisory Committee to replace Dr. Harrison.

Dr. Walker moved to accept the appointment of Colonel Setnor for the CRNA position on the Advisory Committee. The motion was seconded and passed.

2018 Committee of the Joint Boards of Nursing and Medicine Dates

Ms. Hershkowitz stated that Ms. Vu provided the 2018 Committee Dates handout for information only. Ms. Douglas reminded the Committee Members to hold those dates either for meetings or hearings.

Dr. Walker asked how Dr. Hills' position fits within the Board of Nursing. Ms. Douglas stated that the previous Deputy Executive Director's position had been vacant for a year. Ms. Douglas said that she reviewed the structure and organization of the Board and decided to focus the position with someone who is knowledgeable about advanced practice. Ms. Douglas noted that Dr. Hills is a lead staff person related to discipline for nurse practitioners and a point of contact for external inquiry about nurse practitioners. Ms. Douglas added that Dr. Hills will also be involved in probable review for nursing cases and will oversee the Compliance Division. Dr. Hills shared her background information with the Committee.

Ms. Dodson informed the Committee that there are few Midwife Programs for a non-nurse with Certified Midwife (CM) degrees in the United States, not Certified Nursing Midwife (CNM) degrees. She added that this group has inquired about the practicing of CMs in Virginia without CNM degree. She asked if the Committee would like for them to present at the Committee's meeting in December. She clarified that this group was not the Certified Professional Midwifes (CPM's) regulated by the Board of Medicine.

Ms. Yeatts stated that the Code of VA would have to be changed to regulate a new profession. Ms. Yeatts said that Ms. Dodson may wish to contact BHP which is an advisory Board to the Department as it conducts studies on the need for regulation of professions. Ms. Douglas added that the contact person at BHP is Dr. Carter.

Dr. Brown reminded the Committee regarding the public comment about "tramadol". Ms. Hershkowitz asked Ms. Yeatts to clarify further. The Committee of the Joint Boards of Nursing and Medicine has discussed the elimination of a separate license for prescriptive authority for nurse practitioners. The Code of Virginia does have certain requirements for prescriptive authority but does not mandate a separate license.

Therefore, the action to implement elimination must be regulatory and begin with a Notice of Intended Regulatory Action (NOIRA).

The NOIRA will include the likelihood that Chapter 40, Regulations for Prescriptive Authority for Nurse Practitioners, will be repealed and the necessary provisions incorporated into a new Part in Chapter 30, Regulations Governing the Licensure of Nurse Practitioners.

BOARD OF NURSING

Accreditation of RN Education programs

Part I

General Provisions

18VAC90-27-10. Definitions.

In addition to words and terms defined in § 54.1-3000 of the Code of Virginia, the following words and terms when used in this chapter shall have the following meanings unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

"Accreditation" means having been accredited by <u>an agency recognized by the U.S.</u> <u>Department of Education to include</u> the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing, the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education, <u>the Commission for Nursing Education</u> <u>Accreditation</u>, or a national nursing accrediting organization recognized by the board.

"Advisory committee" means a group of persons from a nursing education program and the health care community who meets regularly to advise the nursing education program on the quality of its graduates and the needs of the community.

"Approval" means the process by which the board or a governmental agency in another state or foreign country evaluates and grants official recognition to nursing education programs that meet established standards not inconsistent with Virginia law.

"Associate degree nursing program" means a nursing education program preparing for registered nurse licensure, offered by a Virginia college or other institution and designed to lead to an associate degree in nursing, provided that the institution is authorized to confer such degree by SCHEV.

"Baccalaureate degree nursing program" or "prelicensure graduate degree program" means a nursing education program preparing for registered nurse licensure, offered by a Virginia college or university and designed to lead to a baccalaureate or a graduate degree with a major in nursing, provided that the institution is authorized to confer such degree by SCHEV.

"Board" means the Board of Nursing.

"Clinical setting" means any location in which the clinical practice of nursing occurs as specified in an agreement between the cooperating agency and the school of nursing.

"Conditional approval" means a time-limited status that results when an approved nursing education program has failed to maintain requirements as set forth in this chapter.

"Cooperating agency" means an agency or institution that enters into a written agreement to provide clinical or observational experiences for a nursing education program.

"Diploma nursing program" means a nursing education program preparing for registered nurse licensure, offered by a hospital and designed to lead to a diploma in nursing, provided the hospital is licensed in this state.

"Initial approval" means the status granted to a nursing education program that allows the admission of students.

"National certifying organization" means an organization that has as one of its purposes the certification of a specialty in nursing based on an examination attesting to the knowledge of the nurse for practice in the specialty area.

"NCLEX" means the National Council Licensure Examination.

"NCSBN" means the National Council of State Boards of Nursing.

"Nursing education program" means an entity offering a basic course of study preparing persons for licensure as registered nurses or as licensed practical nurses. A basic course of study shall include all courses required for the degree, diploma, or certificate.

"Nursing faculty" means registered nurses who teach the practice of nursing in nursing education programs.

"Practical nursing program" means a nursing education program preparing for practical nurse licensure that leads to a diploma or certificate in practical nursing, provided the school is authorized by the Virginia Department of Education or by an accrediting agency recognized by the U.S. Department of Education.

"Preceptor" means a licensed nurse who is employed in the clinical setting, serves as a resource person and role model, and is present with the nursing student in that setting, providing clinical supervision.

"Program director" means a registered nurse who holds a current, unrestricted license in Virginia or a multistate licensure privilege and who has been designated by the controlling authority to administer the nursing education program.

"Recommendation" means a guide to actions that will assist an institution to improve and develop its nursing education program.

"Requirement" means a mandatory condition that a nursing education program must meet to be approved or maintain approval.

"SCHEV" means the State Council of Higher Education for Virginia.

"Site visit" means a focused onsite review of the nursing program by board staff, usually completed within one day for the purpose of evaluating program components such as the physical location (skills lab, classrooms, learning resources) for obtaining initial program approval, in

response to a complaint, compliance with NCLEX plan of correction, change of location, or verification of noncompliance with this chapter.

"Survey visit" means a comprehensive onsite review of the nursing program by board staff, usually completed within two days (depending on the number of programs or campuses being reviewed) for the purpose of obtaining and maintaining full program approval. The survey visit includes the program's completion of a self-evaluation report prior to the visit, as well as a board staff review of all program resources, including skills lab, classrooms, learning resources, and clinical facilities, and other components to ensure compliance with this chapter. Meetings with faculty, administration, students, and clinical facility staff will occur.

18VAC90-27-220. Maintaining an approved nursing education program.

A. The program director of each nursing education program shall submit an annual report to the board.

B. Each Prior to (insert three years from the effective date of this regulation), each registered nursing education program shall be reevaluated as follows:

1. Every <u>registered</u> nursing education program that has not achieved accreditation as defined in 18VAC90-27-10 shall be reevaluated at least every five years by submission of a comprehensive self-evaluation report based on Parts II (18VAC90-27-30 et seq.) and III (18VAC90-27-150 et seq.) of this chapter and a survey visit by a representative or representatives of the board on dates mutually acceptable to the institution and the board.

2. A <u>registered nursing education</u> program that has maintained accreditation as defined in 18VAC90-27-10 shall be reevaluated at least every 10 years by submission of a comprehensive self-evaluation report as provided by the board. As evidence of compliance with specific requirements of this chapter, the board may accept the most recent study report, site visit report, and final decision letter from the accrediting body. The

board may require additional information or a site visit to ensure compliance with requirements of this chapter. If accreditation has been withdrawn or a program has been placed on probation by the accrediting body, the board may require a survey visit. If a program fails to submit the documentation required in this subdivision, the requirements of subdivision 1 of this subsection shall apply.

After (insert three years from the effective date of this regulation), each registered nursing education program shall have accreditation or candidacy status and shall be reevaluated at least every 10 years by submission of a comprehensive self-evaluation report as provided by the board. As evidence of compliance with specific requirements of this chapter, the board may accept the most recent study report, site visit report, and final decision letter from the accrediting body. The board may require additional information or a site visit to ensure compliance with requirements of this chapter. If a program has been placed on probation by the accrediting body, the board may require a survey visit. If a program fails to submit the documentation required in this subdivision, the requirements of subdivision 1 of this subsection shall apply.

C. Each practical nursing education program shall be reevaluated as follows:

 Every practical nursing education program that has not achieved accreditation as defined in 18VAC90-27-10 shall be reevaluated at least every five years by submission of a comprehensive self-evaluation report based on Parts II (18VAC90-27-30 et seq.) and III (18VAC90-27-150 et seq.) of this chapter and a survey visit by a representative or representatives of the board on dates mutually acceptable to the institution and the board.
 A practical nursing education program that has maintained accreditation as defined in 18VAC90-27-10 shall be reevaluated at least every 10 years by submission of a comprehensive self-evaluation report as provided by the board. As evidence of compliance with specific requirements of this chapter, the board may accept the most recent study report, site visit report, and final decision letter from the accrediting body. The board may require additional information or a site visit to ensure compliance with requirements of this chapter. If accreditation has been withdrawn or a program has been placed on probation by the accrediting body, the board may require a survey visit. If a program fails to submit the documentation required in this subdivision, the requirements of subdivision 1 of this subsection shall apply.

<u>D.</u> Interim site or survey visits shall be made to the institution by board representatives at any time within the initial approval period or full approval period as deemed necessary by the board. Prior to the conduct of such a visit, the program shall submit the fee for a survey visit as required by 18VAC90-27-20.

D. E. Failure to submit the required fee for a survey or site visit may subject an education program to board action or withdrawal of board approval.

18VAC90-27-230. Continuing and withdrawal of full approval.

A. The board shall receive and review the self-evaluation and survey reports required in 18VAC90-27-220 B or <u>C</u> or complaints relating to program compliance. Following review, the board may continue the program on full approval so long as it remains in compliance with all requirements in Parts II (18VAC90-27-30 et seq.), III (18VAC90-27-150 et seq.), and IV (18VAC90-27-210 et seq.) of this chapter.

B. If the board determines that a program is not maintaining the requirements of Parts II, III, and IV of this chapter or for causes enumerated in 18VAC90-27-140, the board may:

1. Place the program on conditional approval with terms and conditions to be met within the timeframe specified by the board; or

2. Withdraw program approval.

C. If the board either places a program on conditional approval with terms and conditions to be met within a timeframe specified by the board or withdraws approval, the following shall apply:

1. No further action will be required of the board unless the program requests an informal conference pursuant to §§ 2.2-4019 and 54.1-109 of the Code of Virginia.

2. If withdrawal or continued program approval with terms and conditions is recommended following the informal conference, the recommendation shall be presented to the board or a panel thereof for review and action.

3. If the recommendation of the informal conference committee is accepted by the board or a panel thereof, the decision shall be reflected in a board order and no further action by the board is required unless the program requests a formal hearing within 30 days from entry of the order in accordance with § 2.2-4020 of the Code of Virginia.

4. If the decision of the board or a panel thereof following a formal hearing is to withdraw approval or continue on conditional approval with terms or conditions, the program shall be advised of the right to appeal the decision to the appropriate circuit court in accordance with § 2.2-4026 of the Code of Virginia and Part 2A of the Rules of the Supreme Court of Virginia.

D. If a program approval is withdrawn, no additional students may be admitted into the program effective upon the date of entry of the board's final order to withdraw approval. Further, the program shall submit quarterly reports until the program is closed, and the program must comply with board requirements regarding closure of a program as stated in 18VAC90-27-240.

BOARD OF NURSING

Amendment to name tag requirement

18VAC90-19-50. Identification; accuracy of records.

A. Any person regulated by this chapter who provides direct client care shall, while on duty, wear identification that is clearly visible and indicates the person's first and last name and the appropriate title for the license, registration, or student status under which he is practicing in that setting. Name identification on a badge for identification of health care practitioners shall follow the policy of the health care setting in which the nurse is employed. Any person practicing in hospital emergency departments, psychiatric and mental health units and programs, or in health care facilities units offering treatment for clients in custody of state or local law-enforcement agencies may use identification badges with first name and first letter only of last name and appropriate title.

B. A licensee who has changed his name shall submit as legal proof to the board a copy of the marriage certificate, a certificate of naturalization, or court order evidencing the change. A duplicate license shall be issued by the board upon receipt of such evidence and the required fee.

C. Each licensee shall maintain an address of record with the board. Any change in the address of record or in the public address, if different from the address of record, shall be submitted by a licensee electronically or in writing to the board within 30 days of such change. All notices required by law and by this chapter to be mailed by the board to any licensee shall be validly given when mailed to the latest address of record on file with the board.

Department of Health Professions

Legislative Proposals for 2018 General Assembly

1) Delivery of DHP subpoenas

Authorize the Department to deliver a subpoena issued pursuant to enforcement of law by registered or certified mail or by commercial parcel delivery service. It will also specify that the Department may seek enforcement of the subpoena in cases of non-compliance.

- 2) Clarification for electronic renewal notice Amend Code sections for the Boards of Funeral Directors and Embalmers, Medicine, and Nursing that require renewal notices to be sent by "mail" to licensees. The amendments will clarify that the board may send such notices electronically.
- Addition of schedule V and naxolone to PMP Add Schedule V drugs for which a prescription has been written and also the drug naloxone to the definition of covered substances to be included on a Prescription Monitoring Program (PMP) report.
- 4) Student exemption for polysomnographic tech Amend the Code relating to a requirement for licensure to practice as a polysomnographic technologist to allow for practice under supervision by a student or person in training for a period of 18 months from the start of the educational program or traineeship extending to a maximum of six months from conclusion of the program to allow time for processing an application for licensure.
- 5) Registration of nonresident warehousers and third-party logistics Authorize the Board of Pharmacy to register nonresident warehousers and nonresident thirdparty logistics providers and to promulgate regulations as necessary to prevent diversion and to protect the public.
- 6) Fentanyl class in Drug Control Act Amend Schedule I of the Drug Control Act to place a fentanyl classification system so a drug with a new fentanyl substance could be immediately deemed to be an illegal substance.
- 7) Mid-level licensure for SW

Create three levels of licensure with a distinction between the bachelor's and master's level persons with a generalist practice and the master's level person who has the education and supervised person to provide clinical social work services.
