	This topic can be removed from the agenda. It was about influenza vaccines. Ron updated the EMT's ability to	
	administer vaccines according to the <i>Code of Virginia §54.1-3408</i> . Guidance documents have been updated on	
	the OEMS website as well. NHTSA just updated the scope of Practice on immunizations and she will email it out.	
	c. CARES – Dr. Brand and Dr. Yee	
	There has been no movement on this. Adam informed that there will be more information on this. Dr. Morgan	
	stated that a regional CARES group has been worked on and more information will be forthcoming.	
	d. MDC Projects – Dr. Yee

	e. State Certification for Assistant Medical Directors (PA and NPs) – Dr. E. Reed Smith	
	Dr. Reed is not in attendance. Dr. Lindbeck discussed this topic and in Pennsylvania, they allow PA and NPs to	
	become Assistant Medical Directors. There is a concern that PA and NP will become the primary medical	
	directors. This topic was tabled.	
VII. New Business	a. Training and Certification Committee Report – Dr. Charles Lane	
	The TCC met yesterday and heavily discussed competencies and Virtual Instructor Led Training issues.	
	b. Virtual Instructor Lead Training (VILT) Course Limitations – Dr. Yee and Dr. Lindbeck	
	There is a limit of 30 participants. The challenge is how to ensure that the learners are engaged, interacting, and	
	participating. A workgroup was established to look further into this matter. The committee continued to	
	discuss this topic in detail. The committee decided to wait until the workgroup meets to take any action.

IX. State OMD Issues – George Li		
	a. Scope of Practice Changes	
	Debbie stated that the workgroup that she was on has finished their work and everything is now in the hands of	
	NHTSA. The document with the recently adopted changes was sent to everyone from Debbie. She also stated	
	that there were no changes at the paramedic level.	
	Dr. Lindbeck and Dr. Yee discussed resuscitation and IM medication guidelines. Dr. Yee asked if the committee	
	wants to create a workgroup to look into this.	
	Debbie stated that once the final document comes out, the ACE Division will look at it and send it out to the	
	committee. It was indicated to make this the educational minimums, not the practice maximums. OEMS will	
	need guidance about how to prepare educators.

	The committee continued to discuss the National Education Standards and National Scope of Practice in detail. Debbie will send out the final draft of the Education Standards. Dr. Yee suggested to table this discussion until next meeting.	
	Dr. Lindbeck made a motion that we should add PPI intrusions for GI bleed to the Virginia scope of practice at the INT level. The motion was seconded. There were no objections. The motion passed.	
	The committee discussed the administration (volume or syringe limited methods) of Epinephrine and Naloxone by EMTs.	
	A motion was made by Dr. Weir to allow volume limited, syringe limited or clearly marked syringe methods of medication preparation/administration for EMT's on the procedures grid. The motion was seconded. The motion passed.	
	Other issues discussed: Taking patients to comprehensive stroke centers and bypassing nearest facilities. Debbie will send this information out to the committee members. An AHA workgroup wrote this and Stroke published it. Per Dr. Yee, we need to collaborate with VSSTF (Virginia Stroke System Task Force) on this.	
	During the OEMS report below, Dr. Lindbeck stated that he is getting emails about administration of medications such as Zofran. A motion was made by Dr. Weir to add a sentence to the previous motion that references Naxolone intranasal administration by the same methodologies of preparing the dose for epinephrine in the procedure grid to provide a mechanism for administering volume limited, syringe limited or clearly marked syringe methods for intranasal Naloxone administration at the EMT levels. The motion was seconded.	
	Dr. Louka suggested to focus more on the procedure and not the specific medications. Dr. Lindbeck suggested going through the Formulary line by line at the next meeting. There was discussion about reconstituting medications including vaccines.	
	about reconstituting medications including vaccines. Dr. Brand made a motion that we add to the Scope of Practice the drawing up and reconstitution of medications and vaccinations. This only applies to meds in the EMS Formulary. The motion was seconded. Motion carries.	
	The committee agreed to add the word vaccine under Biological for Advanced. Add "Excludes vaccines to minors" in the right hand column section. A motion was made to make the above changes. All committee members were in favor.



Background

The Virginia EMS Scholarship Program is managed by the Virginia Office of Emergency Medical Services providing scholarship awards to current Virginia EMS Providers and those seeking to become EMS providers in the Commonwealth.

The scholarship program supports students who are accepted into an eligible Virginia approved initial certification program—EMR, EMT, Advanced EMT and Paramedic.


The scholarship program is not designed to provide 100% funding for a training program.

FY21 Scholarship Budget

The FY20 budget for the Virginia EMS Scholarship Program is \$2,000,000.00. The following chart shows a breakdown of funding based on three (3) categories: 1) Applications Pending Approval, 2) Total Scholarship \$ Awarded, and Remaining Funds.


- **Application Pending Approval** this category includes the total dollar value for all applications received from June 4, 2021 through March 31, 2020. This covers Q1, Q2, & Q3 of FY20.
- **Total Scholarship \$ Awarded** this category is the total dollar value for all scholarship applications which have been approved and are in the process of being paid. Since the Virginia EMS Scholarship module is new, OEMS staff have only approved a small group of test applications as we work through the payment processes with the VDH Office of Financial Management.
- **Remaining Funds** this category is the total dollar value of funds remaining in the scholarship program and available for to students for the remainder of the fiscal year.






Breakdown of Pending Applications




Total \$ of Pending Applications by Level
