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Description of Department for the Blind and Vision Impaired

The Department for the Blind and Vision Impaired (DBVI) is the state agency charged with general supervision of vocational rehabilitation and independent living services provided to individuals who are blind, vision impaired, or deafblind. The agency is either mandated or otherwise authorized to provide specialized programs including special education to children and youth; rehabilitation teaching and independent living; special library services to individuals who are blind or have print disabilities; and manufacturing, retail, and contract services for creating employment opportunities for people who are blind. DBVI administers the Randolph-Sheppard Act Vending Facility Program in the Commonwealth and the Vocational Rehabilitation Program including workforce services that prepare individuals who are blind, vision impaired, or deafblind for competitive employment and provide business with a pipeline of qualified workers. The agency also operates a residential rehabilitation center, the Virginia Rehabilitation Center for the Blind and Vision Impaired. Code of Virginia, Title 22.1-217, Chapter 13, Article 2 and Title 51.5, Chapter 12.

<p>Brief Overview DBVI seeks to amend 22VAC45-20 (Regulations to Govern the Operation of Vending Facilities in Public Buildings and Other Property) to include text from 22VAC45-40 (Rules and Regulations Governing Vending Facilities in Public Buildings). The agency will propose amending 22VAC45-20 while simultaneously repealing 22VAC45-40.</p> <p>This action consolidates two regulations pertaining to operation of vending stands, updates the name of the agency from the Department for the Visually Handicapped to the Department for the Blind and Vision Impaired, updates language used to describe individuals who are potentially eligible to participate in the Randolph-Sheppard Vending Stand Program, removes outdated regulatory citations, and updates governing authorities.</p>
