The proposed regulations outline requirements made on the Cemetery Board concerning proper notification of the public of certain regulatory actions, including the development and maintenance of a mailing list, establishment of public comment periods and public hearings, and the notice requirements of meetings.

These regulations are, in substance, nearly identical to the Public Participation Guidelines already in place for all other regulatory boards under the authority of the Department of

Professional and Occupational Regulation. Additionally, these proposed regulations are original, and, subsequently, do not contain any changes or amendments to existing regulations.

On January 19, 2000, the Cemetery Board adopted a final regulation entitled "Cemetery Board Public Participation Guidelines", 18 VAC 47-10-10, et seq.

Chapter 23.1 of Title 54.1 of the Code of Virginia creates the statutory authority for the regulation of Cemetery Operators, Perpetural Care Trust Funds and Preneed Burial Contracts and gives the Cemetery Board certain powers and duties as found in § 54.1-201 of the Code of Virginia. These statutes mandate the Cemetery Board to promulgate regulations.

Additionally, the Board is, mandated by Chapter 1.1:1 of Title 9 of the Code of Virginia to promulgate public participation guidelines. The basis for this authority is found under § 54.1-201.5 and § 54.1-2313.D & E of the Code of Virginia.
