Currently, the schedule of penalties for first-offense violations are based off the lower maximums listed in §4.1-227 of the Code of Virginia prior to the 2017 amendments that raised the civil penalty for first offense violations.

The proposed regulation amendment changes the penalty schedule by increasing the amounts to reflect higher fee rates based of the new maximums in §4.1-227, but the increases are still lower than the maximum that the Code of Virginia permits ABC to charge.

On January 10, 2018, the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board adopted an amendment to 3-VAC5-70 OTHER PROVISIONS, amending the existing regulation 3-VAC5-70-210 Schedule of penalties for first-offense violations to proceed under the fast track regulatory process.

Section 4.1-101 of the Code of Virginia (Code) establishes the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC Board.)

Section 4.1-103 of the Code enumerates the powers of the Board which includes the authority to adopt regulations and to do all acts necessary or advisable to carry out the purposes of Title 4.1 of the Code (ABC Act). Section

Section 4.1-103(24) permits the Board to promulgate regulations in accordance with the Administrative Process Act and Section 4.1-111. 4.1-103(26) states the Board may assess and collect civil penalties and civil charges for violations of this title and Board regulations.

Section 4.1-227(B) permits the Board to impose and collect civil penalties.

The purpose of this regulation change is to amend civil penalties for first-offense violations so that they reflect current percentages.

The amendments are expected to be noncontroversial because the amendments put the civil penalties in compliance with the new penalty maximums reflected in the Code of Virginia, but they offer the licensee

The schedule of penalties for first offenses increases the monetary sanctions by either \$250 or \$500 over what was previously charged.

The primary advantage to this regulation amendment is that it will it will encourage resolution of first offense violations because the regulation offers lower amounts than what the Code of Virginia permits ABC to charge for violation of these offenses. There are no disadvantages to the agency or the Commonwealth. Pertinent matters to the regulated community, government officials, and the public are licensees are subjected to a higher fee schedule; however, even with the increased penalty, the increase is still lower than the maximum that the Code of Virginia permits ABC to charge.
