Currently, regulations of the Board of Medicine provide for a fee of \$25 for a check that is not paid by a financial institution on which it is drawn because of insufficient funds in the account. The Administrative Process Act specifies that the penalty shall be \$35 or the amount of any costs, whichever is greater.

§ 2.2-614.1. Authority to accept revenue by commercially acceptable means; service charge; bad check charge.

*...C. If any check or other means of payment tendered to a public body in the course of its duties is not paid by the financial institution on which it is drawn, because of insufficient funds in the account of the drawer, no account is in the name of the drawer, or the account of the drawer is closed, and the check or other means of payment is returned to the public body unpaid, the amount thereof shall be charged to the person on whose account it was received, and his liability and that of his sureties, shall be as if he had never offered any such payment. A penalty of \$35 or the amount of any costs, whichever is greater, shall be added to such amount. This penalty shall be in addition to any other penalty provided by law, except the penalty imposed by § [58.1-12](#) shall not apply.*

Accordingly, the Board has adopted amendments under an exempt action to conform regulations to the statute.

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On December 16, 2005, the Board of Medicine adopted an exempt action to amend the returned check fee regulations to conform to § 2.2-614.1 of the Code of Virginia. Although required to comply with the Virginia Register Act, the agency is exempt from provisions of the Administrative Process Act for the implementation of these regulations pursuant to § 2.2-4006 A 4, which grants an exemption if the action is: “Necessary to conform to changes in Virginia statutory law or the appropriation act where no agency discretion is involved.”
