SUBJECT: Regulations Relating to Compulsory Minimum Training Standards for Dispatchers–6VAC20-60

In response to a request from the Department of Criminal Justice Services ("Department"), I have reviewed the proposed regulation, 6VAC20-60, relating to Compulsory Minimum Training Standards for Dispatchers. The *Code of Virginia* requires the Department to establish compulsory minimum training standards for all dispatchers employed by or in any local or state government agency, whose duties include the dispatching of law-enforcement personnel. Virginia Code § 9.1-102.10. Virginia Code § 9.1-102 requires the Department to adopt regulations, pursuant to the Administrative Process Act (§ 2.2-4000 et seq.), for the administration of this chapter. Upon review of the aforesaid regulation, I find the proposed regulation to be constitutional, consistent with the statutory authority granted by Virginia Code § 9.1-102 of the Code of Virginia, and in conformity with existing statutory provisions.
