Currently, the department's harvest reporting regulations for certain game species are outlined in multiple chapters and multiple regulation sections in those chapters. These regulation amendments would establish a new, single regulation section in Chapter 40 outlining requirements for reporting the harvest of certain game species and enable the repeal of eight (8) existing regulation sections (4VAC15-40-300, 4VAC15-50-81, 4VAC15-50-91, 4VAC15-70-70, 4VAC15-90-231, 4VAC15-90-241, 4VAC15-240-81, and 4VAC15-240-91). The amendment would also establish a requirement for reporting the harvest of gray foxes for which populations have declined significantly over the past few decades and update the harvest reporting regulation section reference in those regulations that provide for elk hunting inside and outside the Elk Management Zone.

Mandate and Impetus

The impetus for this regulatory amendment is the Board's biennial periodic review of its hunting, trapping, and wildlife-related regulations. Internal staff review, wildlife management and recreation goals, and consideration of public input through the Board's regulation review and amendment process deemed these amendments advisable.
