Chapter 85 of the 2009 Acts of Assembly, which arose from the efforts of the Attorney General's Government and Regulatory Reform Task Force, provides state agencies that have regulations promulgated in accordance with the Virginia Administrative Process Act (VAPA) with the opportunity to amend their regulations in a VAPA exempt action to provide for the submittal of required documents or payments by electronic means. In order to qualify as an exempt action, the amended regulations must be adopted by December 31, 2010. The amendments to the Virginia Commercial Driver's License Regulations are being made pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 85 of the 2009 Acts of Assembly.

The Virginia Commercial Driver's License Regulations establish certain rules and standards which govern the licensing of drivers of commercial motor vehicles by DMV. In particular, they set forth rules and procedures for the administration of third party testing programs. In amending these regulations, DMV has deleted language such as "on a form provided by the department" or "in writing" and replaced it with the language "in a format prescribed by the department." This new broad language will allow DMV to work in close consultation and partnership with third party testing programs to develop and utilize the electronic filing technologies that best address the needs and requirements of DMV and these entities.
