This regulatory action conforms the regulation to the requirements of Chapter 794 of the Acts of Assembly (2011), which becomes effective July 1, 2013. The regulatory action complies with state law requirements for the social worker title and makes technical corrections.

The regulation is amended to comply with restrictions on the use of the title "Social Worker" pursuant to Virginia Code § 54.1-3709. The regulation is also amended to incorporate necessary technical changes.

This action is necessary due to the Code changes effective July 1, 2013, which stipulate the title of social worker cannot be used by an individual unless he or she has received "a baccalaureate or master's

degree in social work from an accredited social work school or program approved by the Council on Social Work Education or a doctorate in social work."
