Purpose

AAccording to the federal government, schools will need 200,000 new teachers a year for the next decade--up from 150,000 in recent years--as student enrollment increases and current teachers retire. As a result, many school systems welcome adults who are willing to leave established careers for teaching. Researcher Emily Feistritzer found that 10 percent of new teachers hired in 1996 came from another profession; the percentage is growing yearly. \cong (U.S. News, 10/26/98). A survey conducted of local school divisions in Virginia supports the need for additional qualified teachers.

An alternative route to licensure does exist in Virginia; however, the current route may be problematic for career switchers who may have related experiences and training. To increase opportunities for school divisions to employ career switchers with rich experiences, an alternative route for career switchers is proposed. This route to licensure will allow career switchers with experience to apply directly to the Department of Education for a license.

<u>Code of Virginia</u>, Section 22.1-16. **Bylaws and regulations generally** states: "The Board of Education may adopt bylaws for its own government and promulgate such regulations as may be necessary to carry out its powers and duties and the provisions of this title."

Code of Virginia, Section 22.1-298. **Regulations governing licensure** states: AThe Board of Education shall, by regulation, prescribe the requirements for the licensure of teachers. Such regulations shall include a requirement that every teacher seeking initial licensure take a professional teacher=s assessment prescribed by the Board. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the Board may provide for the issuance of a provisional license, valid for a period not to exceed three years, to any person who does not meet this requirement or any other requirement for licensure by law.

Substance

The proposed regulations recognizes the varied experiences of individuals with degrees who are interested in teaching in the public schools. The proposed regulation would remove potential barriers, such as requiring employment prior to licensure. Currently, individuals seeking licensure via the alternative route must apply for a license through an employing school division; therefore, they must be employed in order to apply for a license.

An alternative route to licensure does exist in Virginia; however, the current route may be problematic for career switchers who may have related experiences and training. To increase opportunities for school divisions to employ career switchers with rich experiences, an alternative route for career switchers is proposed. This route to licensure will allow career switchers with experience to apply directly to the Department of Education for a license.

The proposal regulatory revision will recognize career switchers' considerable expertise and training. Instructional opportunities offered in other careers may include multi-cultural sensitivity, motivational theory, management by objective, organization skills, accountability, leadership, assessment, substance abuse, counseling skills, and computer technology. This proposal would lessen the burden on career switchers interested in teaching in Virginia by recognizing their extensive training and experiences.

Family Impact Statement
