The purpose of this chapter is to promote public involvement in the development, amendment, or repeal of the regulations of the Department for the Blind and Vision Impaired. regarding agency regulations is in line with the federal regulations pertaining to the provision of vocational rehabilitation services and requirements set forth in §§ 2.2-4007.02. These regulations do not conflict with state or federal law or regulation and have little to no economic impact on regulations on small business. There have not been any substantial changes in technology, economic conditions, or other factors that impact the importance or implementation of the regulation
