Mr. Melis provided an in depth review of the powers and duties of the Director's Report Board, the organization of the Agency, the Regulatory Reduction Initiative, and the 2018 Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission (JLARC) report.

Mr. Melis also reviewed and discussed the DPOR Biennial Report: https://www.dpor.virginia.gov/News/Reports-Studies The Biennial Report is completed every two years by November 1, and is presented to the Governor and the General Assembly.

Mr. Melis informed the Board that the 2018 JLARC Report recommended the Board for Professional and Occupational Regulation be more involved in evaluating the need for proposed licensing programs. In addition to utilizing the Board more, he also stated that the JLARC report recommended separate dedicated staffing for the Board.

BPOR In the Coming Years

Mr. Melis also informed the Board of the progress on procurement of a new licensing system. He stated that consulting firm, Guidehouse, performed an in depth analysis of the needs of the agency with regards to licensing, case management, record management, and other technology needs. Guidehouse prepared a market analysis of programs that will meet the needs of the agency. The Request for Proposal (RFP) will likely be out for proposals by January 15. Mr. Melis commented that the process could take up to 18 months.

Ms. Nosbisch informed the Board that she will email the 2018 JLARC Other Business Report and the 2019 BPOR Interim Report- Evaluation of the Need for Continued Regulation of Certain Professions & Occupation as Recommended by JLARC.
