Finding a quorum of the Board present, Ms. Trigiani, Chair, called the Call to Order meeting to order at 9:36 a.m.

Ms. Henshaw advised the Board of amendments to the agenda. Mr. Approval of Agenda Orlando moved to approve the agenda as amended. Ms. Waddell seconded the motion which was unanimously approved by: Baker, Kacani, Lockett Reese, Orlando, Trigiani, Waddell, and Watts.

Arrival of Board Member

There were no members of the public present to address the Board.

Public Comment Period

Mr. Haughwout provided the Board with an update of temporary cease and desist actions from March 15, 2018.

Follow-up Report from Temporary Cease and Desist Actions from March 15, 2018 Meeting

Mr. Haughwout advised the Board there were no temporary cease and desist orders to consider, as all condominium registrations listed for consideration are now in compliance or in the process of registration termination.

Mr. Haughwout provided an update on the current status of the regulatory review processes for the Board's regulatory packages:

Update on Regulatory Review Process

Amendments to the CIC Management Information Fund Regulations regarding the 2018 fee reduction became effective June 1, 2018.

A notice of intended regulatory action (NOIRA) for a general review of the CIC Management Information fund was submitted for executive branch review on May 31, 2018. A panel of stakeholders will be organized to review the regulatory actions. Ms. Henshaw advised the Board that Board members Orlando and Watts expressed interest in participating on the stakeholder panel, and advised that members of the public will also be invited to participate on the stakeholder panel. Ms. Kacani moved to appoint, with Mr. Orlando serving as Chair, Orlando and Watts, and authorized staff to work with the Board Chair to select members of the public to participate on the panel as well. Ms. Overholt seconded the motion which was unanimously approved by: Baker, Kacani, Lockett Reese, Orlando, Overholt, Trigiani, Waddell, and Watts.

Mr. Haughwout presented for Board review a draft guidance document

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for time-share public offering statements and offering statements delivered via alternative media. Discussion was held on the definition of "alternative media", and acknowledgement of receipt of the public offering statement. After discussion, Mr. Watts moved to authorize staff to make the draft guidance document available for a 30-day public comment period, after which any comments received will be reviewed at the next Board meeting. Ms. Lockett Reese seconded the motion which was unanimously approved by: Baker, Kacani, Lockett Reese, Orlando, Overholt, Trigiani, Waddell, and Watts.

Mr. Haughwout presented for Board review a draft guidance document for determining the value of blanket surety bonds submitted by developers in lieu of escrowing deposits. After discussion, Ms. Overholt moved to authorize staff to make the draft guidance document available for a 30-day public comment period, after which any comments received will be reviewed at the next Board meeting. Ms. Lockett Reese seconded the motion which was unanimously approved by: Baker, Kacani, Lockett Reese, Orlando, Overholt, Trigiani, Waddell, and Watts.

Ms. Henshaw asked the Board to consider whether staff may publish a guidance document as final if no public comments are received on the draft guidance document. Discussion was held on current public participation guideline requirements and the methods in which staff notifies the public of public comment periods. After discussion, Mr. Watts moved to authorize staff to publish guidance documents as final if no public comments are received on the draft guidance document. Mr. Orlando seconded the motion which was unanimously approved by: Baker, Kacani, Lockett Reese, Orlando, Overholt, Trigiani, Waddell, and Watts.

Questions Received Pertaining to HB674/SB443

Mr. Haughwout asked the Board to consider whether escrow accounts held by real-estate brokers or attorneys for time-share purchases must be held separately in banks located in Virginia. House Bill 674 and Senate Bill 443 states that escrow deposits for time-share purchases must be "...deposited in a separate account ...that is federally insured and located in Virginia; except where such deposits are being held by a real estate broker or attorney licensed under the laws of the Commonwealth, such funds may be placed in that broker's or attorney's regular escrow account and need not be placed in a separate designated account." After discussion, and based on consultation with counsel, the Board agreed by consensus that the requirement in HB674/SB443 for separate accounts to be located in Virginia is not applicable to the regular escrow accounts of real-estate brokers or attorneys that are licensed by the Commonwealth of Virginia.

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Mr. Haughwout presented the Board with draft amendments to the Time-Share Regulations as a result of HB674/SB443, which passed during the 2018 General Assembly session. The legislation eliminates the requirement for developers to post a bond or letter of credit with the Board to insure escrow deposits and allows developers of certain timeshare projects to post and maintain a corporate surety bond or irrevocable letter of credit with the Board in lieu of escrowing deposits. The proposed regulatory amendments include (i) removing references to escrow bond/letter of credit requirement; (ii) revising time-share annual report requirements; (iii) revising procedures for return of bonds/letters of credit; (iv) revising public offering statement requirements related to the escrowing of deposits; and (v) removing the requirement of registered time-share resellers to post an escrow bond/letter of credit with the Board. After discussion, Ms. Overholt moved to approve the draft text and authorize staff to file an exempt action to amend the Time-Share Regulations in order for the regulations to be consistent with statute. Mr. Orlando seconded the motion which was unanimously approved by: Baker, Kacani, Lockett Reese, Orlando, Overholt, Trigiani, Waddell, and Watts.

Consider Exempt Action to Amend Time-Share Regulations to Implement HB674/SB443

The Board recessed from 10:47 a.m. to 11:15 a.m.

Discussion was held on the process for public comments on documents that are not within the scope of the Administrative Process Act, and the authority of the Board to exclude comments received outside of the public comment periods for such documents.

The Board reviewed public comments received on the drafts of proposed revisions to the POA Disclosure Packet Notice and the proposed new Condominium Resale Certificate Notice. The Board considered for approval draft revisions to the POA Disclosure Packet Notice and the draft of the new Condominium Resale Certificate Notice. After review and discussion of the draft documents, the public comments received on the draft documents, and further revisions to the draft documents, Ms. Kacani moved to adopt the POA Disclosure Packet Notice and the Condominium Resale Notice as revised. Final revisions adopted by the Board will be incorporated into the documents and submitted to the Board's Chair for final review prior to publication by staff. Mr. Orlando seconded the motion which was approved by: Baker, Kacani, Lockett Reese, Orlando, Overholt, Trigiani, and Waddell. Mr. Watts opposed. The Board thanks all public commenters for their contributions and participation.
