> Re: Proposed Emergency Regulations Governing Certification of Certain Institutions to Confer Degrees and Certificates (8 VAC 40-31-10 et seq.)

Dear Dr. LaVista:

You ask whether the State Council of Higher Education for Virginia possesses the requisite statutory authority to promulgate the above proposed regulations on an emergency basis.

I have reviewed the above-referenced regulations. In my view, the Council has the authority to find that the adoption of these regulations on an emergency basis is necessitated by and emergency situation, as defined in section 2.2-4011.A, item (ii), which states that an "emergency situation" is a situation "in which Virginia statutory law or the appropriation act or federal law or federal regulation requires that a regulation be effective in 280 days or less from its enactment." Chapter 911 of the 2002 Acts of Assembly, cl. 7 provides: "That the State Council of Higher Education shall adopt regulations to implement the provisions of this act to be effective within 280 days of its enactment."
