The purpose of the proposed action is to reissue the existing Virginia Pollution Abatement (VPA) General Permit for Confined Animal Feeding Operations. This action will also amend the regulation, where applicable, to reflect changes to 40 CFR Parts 9, 122, 123, and 412, as published in the Federal Register Volume 68, No. 29, dated February 12, 2003. The current VPA general permit expires November 16, 2004. This VPA General Permit Regulation for Confined Animal Feeding Operations 9VAC25-192 governs the management of pollutants at concentrated animal feeding operations (CAFOs) with 300 or more animal units utilizing a liquid manure

collection and storage system. A new general permit regulation 9VAC25-191 is being proposed in accordance with §62.1-44.17:1 of the Code of Virginia to regulate certain CAFOs under the Virginia Pollution Discharge Elimination System (VDPES) as required by the federal CAFO rule, which became effective April 14, 2003. 9VAC25-191 affects a subset of CAFOs currently regulated by 9VAC25-192. This action is being taken to amend 9VAC25-192 to exclude those CAFOs that will be regulated by 9VAC25-191, and to make it consistent with the requirements of the proposed regulation.

Family Impact Statement

Because CAFOs are currently regulated in Virginia, and this action serves only to transfer the regulatory mechanism governing select CAFOs from the VPA regulatory system to the VPDES regulatory system, it is not expected to have significant impact on family or family stability.
