The State Water Control Board proposes to amend the VPDES General Permit Regulation for Seafood Processing Facilities in order to reissue the general permit for another five year term. The reissued general permit will replace current General Permit VAG52 which will expire on July 24, 2001. The existing regulation sets forth guidelines for the permitting of wastewater discharges from seafood processing facilities, and establishes limitations and monitoring requirements for flow, pH, biochemical oxygen demand, total suspended solids, and oil and grease based on the species processed and the applicable effluent guidelines established by the Environmental Protection Agency in 40 CFR Part 408. The regulation also sets forth the

minimum information requirements for all requests for coverage under the general permit. No significant changes to the existing regulation are proposed in this amendment.
