The General Assembly passed SB 1049 during the 2013 session. The bill provides that candidates are given an opportunity to appeal a decision of signature insufficiency and that "[t]he State Board shall develop procedures for the conduct of such an appeal."

The current regulation before you provides a regulation process that fills in specific procedures not directly addressed by the legislation, including:

- Documents that must be submitted with a notice of appeal
- Notary requirements for the notice of appeal
- Who bears the burden of proof
- Necessary documentation to support claims of eligibility
- The necessary number of board members' acquiescence necessary to reverse a previously-rendered eligibility determination of a signature
