Subject: Letter of Assurance for Amendment to Regulation 1VAC 20-60-50

I have reviewed the proposed amendment to regulation 1 VAC 20-60-50, regarding overfull optical scanner ballot containers. In my view as counsel to the State Board of Elections, it has the authority to promulgate this regulation pursuant to Virginia Code § 24.2-103. This regulatory action is exempt from the Administrative Process Act pursuant to Virginia Code § 2.2-4002(B)(8) as it relates to the conduct of elections. The proposed amendment does not appear to conflict with the Constitution of the United States or the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Virginia, or any federal or state law currently in effect.

This memorandum addresses legal matters only and is not intended to serve, nor should it be construed, as a comment for or against the merits of the proposed amendment.

This regulatory action amending 1VAC 20-60 addresses an issue raised to the Department of Elections by the General Registrar community. Registrars face special issues regarding overfull optical scan ballot containers at the general registrar's office, where voting is conducted for forty-five days rather than just Election Day itself and at satellite locations. Registrars have requested that the Department of Elections provide an alternative process for dealing with overfull optical scan ballot containers at the general registrar's office and satellite locations. This regulatory action provides an alternative process that will continue to keep the overflow ballots safe and secure.
