The Boards of Medicine and Nursing adopted amendments to 18VAC90-40 as directed by <u>HB699</u>, Chapter 448 of the 2024 Acts of Assembly. The Boards adopted amendments that mirror the language in the legislation, which requires specific patient counseling prior to initiation of opioid treatment, regardless of the length of treatment.
