This action removed subparagraph (o)(8)(ii) of §1926.60, which specifies procedures for employee record retention in the event an employer ceases to do business and there is no successor. The purpose of this change is to discontinue the requirement to notify the Director of the National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH), U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, or their designee, at least 90 days prior to disposal of employee records, where an employer ceases to do business and there is no successor to receive and retain the employees records.

The requirement to comply with the transfer of records, in accordance with §1910.1020(h), as specified by §1926.60 (o)(8), would remain.

Statement of final agency action

On June 14, 2018, the Safety and Health Codes Board adopted federal OSHA's correcting amendment to the Methylenedianiline Standard for the Construction Industry, §1926.60, with an effective date of September 15, 2018.
