The General Procedures and Information for Licensure ("General Procedures") applies to child day centers, family day homes, and family day systems that are licensed by the Virginia Board of Education ("Board"). The chapter sets out requirements and procedures for the licensure process, including: the application process; license maintenance; inspections; and enforcement of violations. The current General Procedures were originally promulgated by the Virginia Department of Social Services ("DSS") in 1984 and adopted by the Board in 2021. The Board intends to repeal the current chapter and promulgate a new chapter in its place in order to implement statutory requirements, clarify existing regulatory requirements, and update practices and procedures.

The Board has determined that significant revisions to the current chapter are necessary in order to implement statutory requirements, clarify existing regulatory requirements, and update practices and procedures. The Board will repeal the current chapter and promulgate a new chapter in its place.

On June 18, 2020, DSS completed a <u>Periodic Review</u> of the *General Procedures* that recommended amending the chapter to removed outdated definitions, add enforcement procedures, and reorganize sections for clarity. However, DSS never began a regulatory action to amend the chapter.

The Board's overall regulatory authority is found in § 22.1-16 of the Code of Virginia, which states that "[t]he Board of Education may adopt bylaws for its own government and promulgate such regulations as may be necessary to carry out its powers and duties and the provisions of this title."

The Board's regulatory authority over child day programs and family day systems is found in § 22.1-289.046 of the Code of Virginia, which states in part that "[t]he Board shall adopt regulations for the activities, services, and facilities to be employed by persons and agencies required to be licensed under this chapter, which shall be designed to ensure that such activities, services, and facilities are conducive to the welfare of the children under the control of such persons or agencies."

The *General Procedures* out requirements and procedures for the licensure process—including the application process, license maintenance, inspections, and enforcement of violations—for child day centers, family day homes, and family day systems. The Board has determined that a comprehensive revision of the chapter is necessary in order to implement statutory requirements, clarify existing regulatory requirements, and update practices and procedures. The current chapter was first promulgated almost three decades ago under the Virginia Department of Social Services. A comprehensive review of the regulations will provide clear, understandable, and updated requirements for licensees and ensure the sufficiency of care provided to children receiving services.

Since the proposed regulatory action involves a comprehensive review of the chapter, revisions to all areas of the chapter will be considered. The regulatory action will potentially include the following:

- Improvements to the licensing process and procedures;
- Updating definitions and terminology;
- Update and clarify license types;
- · Addition of performance levels for license issuance;
- · Revision of risk assessment processes; and
- Revision to processes related to investigations, sanctions, and compliance

The Board considered amending the *General Procedures and Information for Licensure* in its current structure and format. However, due to the number of updates and revisions, the Board has determined that promulgation of a new chapter will be more expedient.
