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Fiscal Impact of Proposed Regulation

Summary:

The current regulations are being revised with some changes and enhancements. This proposed regulation updates the physical examination requirements and the initial and renewal licensing requirements, modifies the licensure denial reporting requirements, and establishes criteria for the Medical Review Officer.

All costs incurred in support of board activities and regulatory operations are paid by the department and funded through fees paid by applicants and licensees. All boards within the Department of Professional and Occupational Regulation must operate within the Code provisions of the Callahan Act (54.1-113), and the general provisions of 54.1-201. Each regulatory program's revenues must be adequate to support both its direct costs and a proportional share of agency operating costs. The department allocates costs to its regulatory programs based on consistent, equitable, and cost-effective methodologies. The board has no other source of income.

Most of the proposed amendments to the regulations clarify existing language; modify definitions to meet changes regarding chemical testing requirements for initial licensing and license renewal or to address historical issues experienced by the Board since the last amendments were promulgated. For those changes that are more substantive the Board looked at methods used in other regulatory programs as well as those used by similar agencies in other states. The Board weighed those alternatives against the burden to its own regulant population, especially small businesses.

The Board will consider all comments received during the public comment period as to proposed alternatives.

Regulatory flexibility analysis
