The Child Support Enforcement Program Manual encompasses processes internal to the Division. It is used by state Division of Child Support Enforcement staff to implement the program. Updates to the manual include:

- Add resource links to the VDSS Privacy and Program Plan Manual VDSS Information Resource Acceptable Use Policy including non-disclosure Virginia Paternity Establishment Program requirements. Also, removed the section as Division employees are not mandatory child abuse or neglect reporters.
- Clarify the Statement of Payments procedure by changing Custodial Parent to applicant.
- Replace Family Engagement Section with updated guidance.
- Clarify that a case is not opened when an applicant is receiving public assistance in another state for the same participants. Also updated to clarify the Statement of Payments procedure by changing the Custodial Parent to applicant.
- Clarify when to send the Acknowledgment of Paternity to Virginia Paternity Establishment Program and when to request an Electronic Birth Query System response. Updated to clarify when to send the genetic testing packet to Virginia Paternity Establishment Program.
- Clarify that administrative enforcement remedies and The Important Notice about Child Support procedures.
- Remove outdated contact information for Defense Manpower Data Center/Defense Enrollment Eligibility Reporting system.
- Include the My Child Support Portal as a service method the Notice of Intent to Suspend Driver's license, remove the contempt and capias requirement for driver's license suspension and provide filing jurisdiction information for a Petition and Order when the Noncustodial Parent has cases in multiple jurisdictions.
- Change name and include new FES guidance.
- Add new section to separate judicial enforcement remedies.
- Clarify that the Division determines good cause exists to not issue the Income Withholding Order.
- Update the steps for how to determine enforcement action.
- Add steps for what to do when the Division collects funds, and the Noncustodial Parent receives Social Security Insurance or a combination of Social Security Insurance /Social Security Disability Insurance benefits or / Social Security Insurance/ Social Security Retirement benefits.
- Clarify what is considered court enforcement.
