Section 63.2-217 of the Code of Virginia (Code) provides the authority for the State Board of Social Services (Board) to adopt regulations to carry out the purpose of Title 63.2. Section 63.2-319 of the Code requires local departments of social services (LDSS) to provide child welfare and other services. Section 63.2-407 of the Code provides that counties and cities may provide public assistance and social services as authorized by the Board.
