<u>VOSH PROGRAM DIRECTIVE</u>: 02-801C <u>ISSUED</u>: 30 September 2014

SUBJECT: Shipyard Employment "Tool Bag" Directive

<u>Purpose</u> This Directive transmits to field personnel comprehensive guidance concerning the

application of occupational safety and health standards in shipyard employment by providing consistent information and ensuring consistent enforcement of the shipyard employment standards. VOSH's jurisdiction over such maritime activity is limited to the

public sector.

This Program Directive is an internal guideline, not a statutory or regulatory rule, and is intended to provide instructions to VOSH personnel regarding internal operation of the Virginia Occupational Safety and Health Program and is solely for the benefit of the program. This document is not subject to the Virginia Register Act or the Administrative Process Act; it does not have general application and is not being enforced as having the

force of law.

Scope This Directive applies VOSH-wide. Virginia unique regulation, 16VAC25-60-150, Maritime

Standards, also applies to all public sector employers and employees engaged in maritime-

related activities as follows:

The employer shall comply with the manufacturer's specifications and limitations applicable to the operation, training, use, installation, inspection, testing, repair and maintenance of all machinery, vehicles, tools, materials and equipment, unless specifically superseded by a more stringent corresponding requirement in Part 1915, 1917, 1918 or 1919. The use of any machinery, vehicle, tool, material or equipment that is not in compliance with any applicable requirement of the manufacturer is prohibited, and shall either be identified by the employer as unsafe by tagging or locking the controls to render them inoperable or be physically removed from its place of use or
