Section 63.2-217 of the Code of Virginia gives the State Board of Social Services the authority and responsibility to promulgate regulations for the administration of social services in the Commonwealth.

The federal authority for this regulation is 45 C.F.R Part 400 , Subpart J, $\S 400.200$, which provides that cash and medical assistance to refugees is available to the extent that funds are appropriated by Congress.

There are no alternatives to achieving the purpose of this regulation. This regulation was promulgated in 1986 for the purpose of limiting cash and medical assistance to refugees to the amount allocated annually by Congress

(1) The regulation was reviewed by the Attorney General's Office in 2013 and determined to be needed.
(2) No public complaints were received. (3) The regulation is concise and understandable. (4) The regulation does not overlap or duplicate any other federal or state rule. (5) A periodic review of this regulation was conducted in 2010. A review by the Department of Social Services and Attorney

General's office, conducted in 2013 found the regulation to be needed. No technology or economic conditions were found to have changed the need for this regulation.
