Section 3.2-6501 of the Code authorizes the Board to adopt regulations regarding the care of animals.

This regulation requires that animal shelters abide by certain sanitation mandates to ensure animal health. Without this regulation, there would be no public oversight of animal shelters and the animals within. These shelters are the subject of great public inquiry and the alternative of repealing the regulations would not be accepted by the public.

Effectiveness

The confinement of animals in animal shelters is intended to protect citizens from potential public health and safety risks associated with free-roaming dogs. Additionally, the regulations requiring confinement of loose animals and a holding period are intended to protect the property rights of individuals, as companion animals are considered personal property under Virginia law. This regulation is clearly written and easily understandable.

Decision

The agency is recommending that the regulation should stay in effect without change. In the period since this regulation was last evaluated, there have been no significant changes that would necessitate amending this regulation.
