The Public Participation Guidelines establish procedures to be used for soliciting the input of interested persons in the formation and development, amendment or repeal of regulations in accordance with the Administrative Process Act. The Guidelines include provisions for petitioning for rulemaking, establishing and maintaining mailing list(s) of interested persons, the use of advisory committees, and the content of notices issued at the Notice of Intent and Notice of Public Comment Period stages.

Basis

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This regulation is required by the Administrative Process Act (Section 9-6.14:1 et seq. of the Code of Virginia). Section 9-6.14:7.1 et seq. sets forth requirements for public participation during rulemaking. Specifically, Section 9-6.14:7.1.D requires that "Public participation guidelines for soliciting the input of interested parties in the formation and development of its regulations shall be developed, adopted and utilized by each agency..." Agencies must follow these guidelines when they are adopting a new regulation, amending an existing regulation or repealing an existing regulation.

The Department's basic law at Section 10.1-1182 et seq. authorizes the department to adopt regulations.

There is no federal statute or regulation that requires states to adopt regulations governing public participation in the rulemaking process.

The Guidelines exceed the minimum requirements of the APA in several respects. However, the requirements are imposed on the department, not on the public. Also, it is important to note that the requirements are there to ensure consistency on the part of the department during all phases of the rulemaking process, citizens have access to information and procedures of the department and citizens are allowed numerous opportunities to provide comment on actions undertaken by the department.

Areas in which the Guidelines exceed the minimum requirements of the APA are:

- The Guidelines require publication of a Notice of Intended Regulatory Action (NOIRA) which incorporates the requirements of the APA and requires the department to provide additional information on the proposed regulatory action including a description of alternatives available to meet the need, a request for comments on the proposed action including comments on costs and benefits of the stated alternative and any other alternatives, and a statement inviting comment on whether the agency should use the participatory approach (under certain conditions). The Guidelines also require the department to hold at least one public meeting no less than 30 days after the publication of the NOIRA, unless the department decides to proceed without holding a public meeting.
- At the Notice of Public Comment (NOPC) stage, the Guidelines place additional requirements on the department for informing the public of the proposed regulatory action including the distribution of a NOPC to interested citizens (mailing lists) which contains the information required by the Registrar plus additional information including a request for comments on the costs and benefits of the proposal or any other alternatives; the date, time and place of at least one public hearing; a discussion of the beneficial impacts of the proposed regulation; an explanation of the need for the proposed regulation and potential consequences that may result in the absence of the regulation; a description of provisions of the proposed regulation which are more restrictive than applicable federal requirements and why they are

needed; a discussion of alternatives that were considered and whether the department believes the proposed regulation is the least burdensome alternative to the public that fully meets the stated purpose of the proposed regulation; and a schedule for evaluating the need and effectiveness after the regulation is adopted.

The purpose of the Guidelines is to establish standard procedures for public input into the adoption, amendment or repeal of the department's regulations and provide the public with assurances that all regulatory actions will be processed by the department in the same manner, unless exempt from the APA. In addition, the Guidelines assure public access to the process at each stage and establish the means for providing notice to the public.

The Guidelines are considered essential for the efficient and economical performance of an important government function because it establishes predictable guidelines to be used by the department during all phases of the regulatory process. It also sets out a predictable timetable for the public to provide meaningful comment on the effects of a proposed action on their health, safety and welfare.

The Guidelines are written in basic, nontechnical language in order to be easily understood by the general public. They clearly state the requirements placed on the department and clearly indicate opportunities for public involvement and information available for public consumption.

Alternatives
