Ms. A. Jones moved to approve the agenda. Mr. Lawless seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved by members: Bedenbaugh,

Mr. Dean moved to approve the minutes from the November 19, 2019,

Geologists meeting. Ms. A. Jones seconded the motion, which was

unanimously approved by members: Bedenbaugh, Brown, Burks, Dean, Giannasi, Hall, A. Jones, R. Jones, Lawless, and Parker.

There was no public comment.

Ms. Nosbisch invited Mr. Waite to provide an overview of the proposed fee increases and to explain the fee structure and financial position of the Board. Mr. Waite also provided an explanation of the Callahan Act and how it is used to determine fee adjustments and to ensure that revenues are sufficient to cover expenses, but not excessive.

After Board discussion, Ms. Nosbisch conducted an informal poll of the members to determine the Board's position on each of the three proposed fee structures (see Addendum 1). The poll indicated that the Board was unanimously in favor of Proposal A.

Ms. Nosbisch then explained the Notice of Intended Regulatory Action (NOIRA) process that will be the next step toward approval of the fee increase.

Ms. A. Jones moved to approve fee structure Proposal A. Mr. Hall seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved by members: Bedenbaugh, Brown, Dean, Giannasi, Hall, A. Jones, R. Jones, Lawless and Parker.

Ms. Nosbisch advised the Board that there were no bills pending in the current General Assembly session that affect the Board's professions. Upon questions from the Board, Ms. Nosbisch indicated that this session of the General Assembly was an even-year long session that will adjourn on March 7, 2020.

Ms. Nosbisch reported to the Board that the Board for Professional and Occupational Regulation (BPOR) discussed and approved a preliminary report required by the JLARC Report at its December 9, 2019, board meeting. The report was filed to the General Assembly prior to the December 31, 2019 deadline. The report evaluated the need for continued regulation of certain professions and occupations. The professions/occupations to be studied are: Professional Soil Scientists, Waste Facility Management Operators, Landscape Architects, Common Interest Community Manager Employees, Certified Interior Designers, Backflow Prevention Device Workers and Wetland Delineators. She further advised that the next step for the recommendations is to hold public hearings and receive comment. She stated that there would be five public hearings across the state:

The final report on the recommendations is due December 31, 2020.

Ms. Nosbisch advised that the Agency is still in process of reducing regulations by 25% as required by action taken during the 2018 General Assembly Session with a deadline of 7/1/21, however, it appears that the Agency may be receiving two additional professions to regulate if the bills continue to progress as they are through the 2020 General Assembly Session.

Mandatory Regulator **Reduction Update**

Ms. Nosbisch reviewed the licensee counts as of January 1, 2020 Soil Scientists –92; Wetland Delineators –116; Geologists – 946

Licensed and Certified Population

Mr. Waite reviewed the Financial Statements with the members following the conclusion of the fee increase discussion and voting that took place earlier in the meeting. Ms. Nosbisch advised the Board that the Financial Statements were for informational purposes.

Financial Statements

Ms. Nosbisch informed the Board members of the upcoming National ASBOG Association of State Boards of Geology (ASBOG) Spring Workshop that will take place in April. Mr. Dean and Mr. Lawless expressed interest in the workshop. Ms. Nosbisch advised that she would be in touch with those interested and the two geologist members who were not present at the meeting to provide additional information.

Ms. Nosbisch reminded the members that all Conflict of Interest (COIA) Training and Financial Disclosure Statements should have now been completed by all members. She indicated that those who attended the Board Member Training Conference in October 2019 and completed the COIA training provided were not required to repeat the training online.

Other Business

Ms. Nosbisch shared information from a February 2020 article form the NCEES Licensure Exchange regarding Arizona introducing universal recognition for out-of-state licenses. Ms. Broz Vaughan pointed out to the Board that Virginia's requirements for individuals coming from out of state are less restrictive as Virginia does not have a one-year residency requirement as does Arizona.

Ms. Nosbisch stated the National Association of State Boards of Geology (ASBOG) exam is transitioning to computer based testing, and will begin with the exam scheduled for March 17, 2023. Mr. Thomas indicated the computer based testing will allow data to be gathered.

ASBOG - CBT Conversion Begins

Board members reviewed wetland delineation training course by Swamp School. Ms. Nosbisch stated this was for informational purposes.

Discussion was held on the wetland delineation training program as presented and whether it should be considered a "course approved by the Board.". Mr. Brown and Mr. Bedenbaugh expressed concerns that the program did not meet the intent of the regulations and that it seemed to be "self taught." They agreed that 18VAC145-30-60.B intent was to have a field component of 32 hours instructed by a Professional Wetland Delineator (PWD). The regulation does not refer specifically to a PWD instructor. Board members discussed options to clarify "course approved by the Board" and what could be done to inform the public that the field component should be taught by a PWD. Ms. Nosbisch informed the Board that to change the regulation or to issue a Guidance Document would take an extended amount of time. The Board discussed potential solutions and Ms. Nosbisch recommended adding language to the DPOR website with information regarding wetland delineator courses being offered. The language for the website will be presented to the Board at the next meeting.

Board members were provided an article by Amy Friedenberger, which highlights the Virginia Tech soil judging team. The article was for informational purposes.

"What's the big deal about dirt?" Virginia Tech's Standout Soil Judging Team

Ms. Nosbisch informed the Board that a citizen member of the Board would be included in the rotation for Board Chair and Vice-Chair. She commented that prior to having citizen members on the Board, the rotation included the three professions represented on the Board.



Registered Geologists who meet the criteria established for nomination may be nominated by their respective state Member Board, OR they may submit their nomination independently for consideration.

EXCEPTIONS TO ELIGIBILITY: A Member who holds an executive office or executive position in an Affiliate Organization is not eligible to be an executive officer of $ASBOG_{\mathbb{R}}$ while holding such office or position in that organization.

Associate Members and International Members are not eligible to be an officer of ASBOG®.

RESPONSIBILITIESAND DUTIES

The Secretary shall, under the direction of the President, be the official recorder of the minutes for all meetings of the Executive Committee, for the Annual Meeting, and any Special Meetings.

The Executive Committee currently meets four times per year -- in conjunction with both the spring and fall Council of Examiners (COE) Workshops, and twice at intermediate times between the Workshops. Attendance and participation at all meetings by the officers of the Executive Committee is anticipated, unless extenuating unusual circumstance prevents it.

On Tue, Jun 7, 2022 at 2:10 PM Justin Brown justinbrownpwd@gmail.com wroted Hi Kate,

I received a call from Virginia DEQ yesterday seeking some guidance and clarification on the qualifying experience for their employees who are in the Virginia Water Protection Program. Essentially, they would like more of their staff to get certified and want to help prepare them in the best way possible. The question was regarding what the board would like to see as far as documentation of the 30 delineations required in 18VAC145-30-50.2. I know that DEQ had recently started implementing a state surface water determination process that has the ability to document that an individual reviewed a wetland delineation for a particular site. Unfortunately, it's a process that is not always used and there isn't always a good paper trail to demonstrate their involvement outside of that process. If this isn't something that has already been addressed, I was wondering if this topic could be added to the next board meeting so that we can discuss what acceptable documentation may look like for that category?

Also, to follow up on our conversation about the course requirement, the FAQ section looks like it might be the best place to address it. A Q&A could look like: "Does the course in state and federal wetland delineation methods need to contain an instructor led field component?" The course must have a field component however it does not need to be instructor led. It is strongly recommended that a course with an instructor led field component is taken to ensure appropriate procedures are learned. I'm open to edits on this though.
