Local Facilities (Staffing/Funding and Unannounced Inspections: Local and Regional Jail and Lockups)

Proposed Board Motion to Grant Suspensions of the 2016 Annual Inspection for the Albemarle/Charlottesville Regional Jail, Chesapeake Correctional Center and Mount Vernon District Lockup.

The attending Correctional Services Committee members voted unanimously to add a motion for recommendation to the full board to approve the plan offered by Chesapeake City Jail to remove all inmates from the temporary housing facilities prior to the mandated March 15, 2018 required date. The full proposal will be offered to the full Board with a recommended motion.

<u>Suggested Board Motion:</u> The Board of Corrections agrees that the City of Chesapeake has met the requirements of legislation passed March 16, 2013 that three temporary structures not be used to house Community-Custody Inmates beyond a period of five years. The City has satisfied the requirement of "approval of an alternative housing agreement" by its execution of an agreement for participation in the Hampton Roads Regional Jail dating back to June 9, 2014.
